In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act relative to historic homes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 266 of the General Laws, as appearing in 2016 Official Edition, is
- 2 hereby amended by inserting after section 95 the following new section:-
- 3 Section 95A.
- In this section, "historic home" shall mean any dwelling house listed in the State
- 5 Register of Historic Places established and maintained by the Massachusetts Historical
- 6 Commission pursuant to G. L. c. 9, section 26C or identified by a plaque identifying the
- 7 homestead as an historic homestead pursuant to G. L. c. 9, section 27D.
- Whoever willfully, intentionally and without right removes items, including, but not
- 9 limited to, copper gutters, copper wiring, aluminum or brick; displaces, destroys, defaces, mars
- or injures the walls, wainscoting or any other part of any historical home, or the appurtenances

- there of, by cutting, breaking, writing or otherwise, shall be punished by a fine of not less than
- \$100 and not more than \$1000 or by imprisonment for not more than 2 years. Any person
- convicted under the provisions of this section shall, in addition to the fine assessed, reimburse
- the historic home owner for the total amount of damage incurred.
