The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

RESOLVE to create a special commission to promote a recoveryfocus in the mental health system

Resolved,

Resolved, That a special commission is hereby established to make an investigation and
study relative to increasing successful and cost effective outcomes of mental health services in
the commonwealth through the use of peer-run and recovery-oriented programs and services.
The commission will be modeled after the President's New Freedom Commission on Mental
Health.

6 The commission shall consist of the co-chairpersons of the joint committee on mental health and substance abuse, who shall serve as co-chairpersons of the commission; the secretary 7 of health and human services or a designee; the commissioner of mental health or a designee; the 8 commissioner of public health or a designee; the director of medicaid or a designee; the 9 commissioner of the Massachusetts rehabilitation commission or a designee; and 5 advocates 10 from the mental health community, 1 of whom shall be from the National Empowerment Center, 11 a statewide peer-technical assistance center; 1 of whom shall be from the Transformation Center, 12 13 a statewide peer-job training organization; 1 of whom shall be a from M-POWER, a statewide peer advocacy organization; 1 of whom shall be from the Association for Behavioral Healthcare 14

15 (ABH), a community services organization; and 1 of whom shall be a family member of a mental16 health consumer.

17 The commission shall: (1) solicit information and input from mental health service providers, consumers, families and any other parties or entities the commission deems 18 appropriate; (2) examine the effectiveness mental health services in promoting successful and 19 cost effective outcomes of recovery and wellness, (3) examine how to effectively involve peers 20 in policy development, service delivery, training and evaluation of services, (4) examine 21 exemplary models of delivery, and use of recovery oriented mental health services in other 22 23 states; and (5) recommend legislation to address ways to improve services for people with mental health care needs. 24

The commission shall submit a report to the general court of the results of its investigation and study and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry its recommendations into effect by filing the same with the clerk of the senate, the clerk of the house of representatives, the joint committee on mental health and substance abuse, and the senate and house committees on ways and means not later than one year from enactment of this bill.
