## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act regarding a model program evaluating treatment of opioid dependent offenders.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The Counties of Suffolk and Middlesex Houses of Correction shall 2 implement a model program evaluating the use of extended release injectable naltrexone with offenders leaving correctional facilities and transitioning to community based treatment 3 programs. Opioid dependent offenders will voluntarily receive treatment with injectable 4 naltrexone and psychosocial support prior to release from identified correctional facility(ies) and 5 6 for a period of time after release from such facilities. A continuum of services will be coordinated between the Correctional Medical Provider, the Bureau of Substance Abuse 7 Services, and MassHealth to ensure offenders receive the necessary services to support 8 successful reentry into society. An evaluation will be conducted to determine the impact of this 9 10 program on criminal recidivism and treatment outcomes.
