10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)

Our mission is to transform life into living for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities. We do this by providing support services in ways that promote value, independence and self-determination. We operate 24/7/365 supporting over 300 individuals with a range of life-enhancing services including: residential programs, therapeutic day program, customized community-based employment and community-based learning services. 200 of our individuals live in Maryland, primarily in the Central Maryland area, but with family from all corners of the state. All of the individuals we support live below the median household income and qualify for Medicaid.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

Up until 2010 services primarily consisted of facility based vocational programs (sheltered workshops) with our community based services constituting about 10% of our programming. Our facilities were constructed to meet these needs large and industrial, with little to no noise dampening. As more services move into the community, there are those with unique needs who need specialized support. Our facility is not conducive to the needs of those with significant behavioral issues and/or complex medical, physical or mental disabilities who will be unable to participate in the community daily. Additionally, agencies like Penn-Mar will experience an increase in individuals needing specialized services in a sensory environment due to the increasing incidence of Autism among school aged children. As those children age out of the public-school system, they will be looking to providers like Penn-Mar to meet their needs.
