10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (Limit Length to Visible area)

Moveable Feast is a volunteer-based Maryland nonprofit organization that improves the lives of people who have HIV/AIDS and other serious illnesses, and who have limited access to healthy and nutritious food. Last year we delivered 702,000 healthy meals to 3637 households. In all that we do, we approach food as medicine: by eating right, individuals with severe illnesses can strengthen their bodies and better fight their diseases. Founded by 7 members of the Baltimore community, in the midst of the AIDS crisis in 1989, we initially provided home-delivered hot meals to individuals living in Baltimore City with HIV/AIDS. In the past 25 years, our services have expanded to include medical transportation, culinary training/employment, medical nutritional therapy/counseling and food services for those facing illnesses beyond HIV/AIDS, such as breast cancer, blood cancer, cardiovascular disease and chronic diabetes. Our service area includes Baltimore City, its five surrounding counties and the entire Eastern Shore. Moveable Feast is supported by more than 3400 volunteers annually who donate more than 30,000 hours of service. Our vision is always to FEED people, FIGHT disease, and FOSTER hope!

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

Since 2010, the number of people who received our meals has jumped 79%. Working to overcome a waiting list of 120 people last year, the thousands of individuals we serve represent only 6% of the 58,390 Marylander's who received new diagnoses of cancer, or who were living with HIV/AIDS. We estimate that another 20% of these individuals could benefit from the services provided by Moveable Feast. To meet the growing demand we will:

(1) Upgrade and replace equipment. Much of our kitchen equipment will soon reach their life expectancy and will need to be replaced over the next three years. New, additional food storage and more efficient equipment will allow us to nearly double the number of meals we prepare and deliver each year. (2) Renovate current facility: this will provide better use of space and enable us to improve the quality of our meals, and bring production efficiency to a new level. (3) Create training and education center: in order to better engage the community, our volunteers and culinary students we will create an innovative space for hands-on learning. 4) Establish a permanent distribution site on the Eastern Shore which will allow us to more efficiently deliver 200,000 meals to 200 households annually.

28. Comments: (Limit Length to Visible area)

Moveable Feast is the only non profit in Maryland whose mission to to provide no cost, home delivered meals and medical nutritional therapy to seriously ill people who can not afford, access or prepare healthy, nutritious foods for themselves. We partner with more than 250 health care providers across the State to insure that individuals in need of healthy and nutritious food have access to the same in the face of their illness. We believe that if we keep people well in the face of their illness, we help reduce the length of hospital stays, reduce the chance of opportunistic infections, and reduce the likelihood of re-admissions, thereby creating a healthier community and reducing the cost of healthcare for all sectors of the community. (cf. MANNA study of 2013)

This year marks our seventh year in the Harry and Jeanette Weinberg Community Center in East Baltimore. We will always be grateful to Del. Hattie Harrison who was critical to the success of this building renovation.

Since 2003, we have been the only no cost, home-delivered food service provider on Maryland's Eastern Shore, last year providing 105,078 meals to 137 households.

For 13 years, our workforce development program/culinary training program in East Baltimore has provided up to 60 individuals/year the opportunity to be Serv Safe certified and secure employment in the food industry. These individuals also work to provide meals to local shelters at an affordable cost to them, and a minimal source of revenue for Moveable Feast.

Moveable Feast was the proud recipient of the first William Donald Schaefer "Helping People" Award in 2012.

In partnership with Humanin, Moveable Feast was the first food service workforce development program in Maryland to receive an EARN grant in 2014.
