## 10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (Limit Length to Visible area)

Elizabeth Seton High School has been a stable force in providing a highly regarded, rigorous, college preparatory high school education to females of low income and working class families in Prince Georges County for over 50 years. The school offers an accredited Maryland State approved High School Curriculum, a scholars program for students with a GPA of 3.5 or higher, 12 AP offerings and 14 Honors Classes. The academic program is widely acclaimed for developing in students the ability to think critically, to organize their ideas logically, and to express their thoughts effectively both orally and in writing.

The school also provides a myriad of after school activities for students by offering 25 athletic teams and 70 extracurricular clubs that develop the students talents and interests. Likewise, the school remains available after school for students to pursue academic research, complete assignments, or work in study groups.

The school also engages students in a strong service learning program, which requires all students to participate in over 60 hours of service to the community and to the disadvantaged.

## 11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

Elizabeth Seton High School will renovate its existing 55 year old library so that it is a progressive educational learning center that meets the needs of 21st century learners including the need to accommodate multiple types of learning (quiet study, presentations, project-based learning, research and reading). The library will become a comfortable, welcoming area that also has adequate work space for the staff as well as up-to-date digital connectivity. The new space will include a reading room, a lounge area, a media area, a study area, workrooms, storage, and office space.

Exterior work is limited to an egress door and associated access. Other aspects of the project include enhancing the mechanical system, replacing lighting with more efficient fixtures, enhancing power locations to support digital media, integrating audio-visual and telecommunications systems into space, procuring new furniture and removing hazardous wastes and asbestos abatement
