House Bill 631 Judiciary (Delegate Otto)

Somerset County - Fines and Forfeitures - Distribution

This bill requires the Clerk of the Circuit Court for Somerset County to transmit fine and specified forfeiture revenues to the Court and Bar Library Account.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: The bill does not materially impact the Judiciary.

Local Effect: Approximately \$2,300 in FY 2019 and \$3,500 annually thereafter is redirected from Somerset County's general fund to the Court and Bar Library Account.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law/Background: Generally, fines, penalties, and forfeitures that are recovered must be paid to the county in which the crime occurred. In all but Anne Arundel, Howard, and Somerset counties, a portion of the fines imposed by and recognizances forfeited to each circuit court are distributed to the clerk of the circuit court and used under the direction of the circuit court judges to augment the court library.

Somerset County has a Court and Bar Library Account, which is supported only by appearance fees collected by the circuit courts. Somerset County advises that additional funds are needed for necessary repairs to the circuit court, including the refurbishing of benches in the main courtroom and the repair of the bar library ceiling.

Local Fiscal Effect: Somerset County estimates that approximately \$2,265 in fiscal 2019, which accounts for the bill's October 1, 2018 effective date, and \$3,500 annually thereafter is redirected from the county's general fund to the clerk of the circuit court and transmitted to the Court and Bar Library Account. The bill does not otherwise materially impact local finances.
