1 AN ACT concerning 2 Foster Care Recipients - Waiver of Tuition and Other Charges 3 FOR the purpose of altering the definition of "tuition" to include certain other charges for attending a public institution of higher education; and generally relating to a 4 5 waiver of tuition and other charges at institutions of higher education for foster 6 care recipients. 7 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, 8 Article – Education 9 Section 15–106.1 10 Annotated Code of Maryland 11 (2008 Replacement Volume and 2012 Supplement) 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 13 14 Article – Education 15 15–106.1. 16 (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated. (a) "Foster care recipient" means an individual who: 17 (2) (i) 18 1. Was placed in an out-of-home placement by the Maryland Department of Human Resources; and 19 20 A. Resided in an out-of-home placement in the 21State at the time the individual graduated from high school or successfully completed 22 a general equivalency development examination (GED); or

- 1 В. Resided in an out-of-home placement in the State on 2 the individual's 13th birthday and was adopted out of an out-of-home placement after 3 the individual's 13th birthday. "Foster care recipient" includes a younger sibling of an 4 individual described in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph if the younger sibling is 5 6 concurrently adopted out of an out-of-home placement by the same adoptive family. 7 "Out-of-home placement" has the meaning stated in § 5-501 of the (3)8 Family Law Article. 9 "Tuition AND OTHER CHARGES" means the charges **(4)** 10 imposed AND ESTIMATED by a public institution of higher education for enrollment **AND ATTENDANCE** at the institution. 11 12 "Tuition AND OTHER CHARGES" includes: (ii) 13 1. [charges] CHARGES for registration and all fees 14 required as a condition of enrollment; AND 2. THE INSTITUTION'S ESTIMATE OF THE EXPENSES 15 16 LIKELY TO BE INCURRED BY AN INDIVIDUAL FOR ROOM AND BOARD FOR 17 ATTENDANCE AT THE INSTITUTION. 18 (b) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, a foster care (1) recipient is exempt from paying tuition AND OTHER CHARGES at a public institution 19 20 of higher education if: 21(i) The foster care recipient is enrolled at the institution on or 22before the date that the foster care recipient reaches the age of 25 years; 23 The foster care recipient is enrolled as a candidate for an (ii) associate's degree or a bachelor's degree; and 2425 (iii) The foster care recipient has filed for federal and State financial aid by March 1 each year. 26 27 If a foster care recipient receives a scholarship or grant for 28 postsecondary study and is enrolled before the recipient's 25th birthday as a candidate 29 for an associate's degree or bachelor's degree at a public institution of higher 30 education, the foster care recipient may not be required to pay the difference between the amount of the scholarship or grant and the amount of the tuition AND OTHER 31 32 CHARGES.
 - (3) A foster care recipient who is exempt from tuition AND OTHER CHARGES under this section continues to be exempt until the earlier of:
