Veterinary Practitioners and Veterinary Technicians – Compounding Prescription Drugs – Authorization and Requirements

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing certain veterinary practitioners and veterinary technicians 5 to compound prescription drugs under certain circumstances; requiring a veterinary 6 clinic or hospital that carries out compounding to establish certain policies and keep 7 certain records regarding certain compounded prescription drugs; authorizing an 8 office manager or veterinary assistant to maintain certain records in a certain 9 manner and update certain policies under certain circumstances; requiring a 10 veterinary clinic or hospital that compounds drugs on-site to take certain actions for 11 purposes of quality assurance; prohibiting a veterinary practitioner or veterinary 12 technician from compounding a drug under certain circumstances; authorizing a 13 veterinary practitioner to purchase, store, and distribute certain compounded drugs under certain circumstances; requiring the State Board of Veterinary Medical 14 Examiners to establish certain safety standards and guidelines; and generally 15 16 relating to the compounding of prescription drugs by veterinary practitioners and 17 veterinary technicians.

- 11 **(E)** A VETERINARY PRACTITIONER SHALL PROVIDE TRAINING FOR A 12 VETERINARY TECHNICIAN WHO IS COMPOUNDING DRUGS OR HANDLING 13 COMPOUNDED DRUGS UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF THE VETERINARY 14 PRACTITIONER.
- 15 **(F)** A VETERINARY CLINIC OR HOSPITAL THAT COMPOUNDS DRUGS ON—SITE 16 SHALL:
- 17 (1) CREATE A QUALITY ASSURANCE PROGRAM THAT DOCUMENTS 18 AND ASSESSES MEDICATION ERRORS;
- 19 **(2) D**OCUMENT ANY CAUSES, REACTIONS, AND TREATMENTS 20 RESULTING FROM MEDICATION ERRORS;
- 21 (3) CONTACT A CLIENT AS SOON AS POSSIBLE TO NOTIFY THEM OF 22 ANY ERRORS AND THE STEPS REQUIRED TO FIX THE ERROR AND TO AVOID INJURY 23 OR ILLNESS; AND
- 24 (4) BE SUBJECT TO QUESTIONS AND REVIEW FROM THE BOARD AND 25 THE STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY.
- 26 (G) A VETERINARY PRACTITIONER OR VETERINARY TECHNICIAN MAY NOT
 27 COMPOUND A DRUG IF THE COMPLEXITY OF COMPOUNDING THE DRUG IS BEYOND
 28 THE VETERINARY PRACTITIONER'S OR VETERINARY TECHNICIAN'S KNOWLEDGE,
 29 SKILL, EXPERTISE, OR AVAILABLE FACILITIES OR EQUIPMENT.

- 1 (H) A VETERINARY PRACTITIONER MAY PURCHASE COMPOUNDED DRUGS 2 FOR OFFICE USE IF THE DRUGS WERE COMPOUNDED AT A LICENSED PHARMACY IN
- 3 THE STATE OR AT AN OUTSOURCING FACILITY.
- 4 (I) A VETERINARY PRACTITIONER MAY STORE COMPOUNDED DRUGS FOR 5 IN-OFFICE OR HOSPITAL USE:
- 6 (1) IF COMPOUNDED AT A LICENSED PHARMACY IN THE STATE OR AT 7 AN OUTSOURCING FACILITY, FOR A PERIOD OF 21 DAYS; AND
- 8 (2) IF COMPOUNDED IN THE VETERINARY PRACTITIONER'S OFFICE 9 OR HOSPITAL, FOR A PERIOD OF 14 DAYS.
- 10 **(J)** A VETERINARY PRACTITIONER MAY DISPENSE COMPOUNDED DRUGS 11 IN-OFFICE:
- 12 (1) FOR IMMEDIATE MEDICAL NEED;
- 13 **(2)** When there are limited or no retail options available 14 To the patient; and
- 15 (3) WHEN THERE IS A POTENTIAL RISK OF HARM TO THE PATIENT IF 16 THE COMPOUNDED DRUGS ARE NOT DISPENSED.
- 17 **(K)** THE BOARD SHALL ESTABLISH STANDARDS AND GUIDELINES FOR VETERINARY PRACTITIONERS AND VETERINARY TECHNICIANS TO ENSURE THE SAFETY OF COMPOUNDED DRUGS.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2024.
