A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Education – Peace and Conflict Studies – High School Course**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the State Department of Education to develop curriculum
4 content standards for a high school course on peace and conflict studies; requiring
5 each county board of education to implement a course on peace and conflict studies
6 in each public high school beginning in a certain school year; requiring each public
7 high school to hire a mediator for a certain purpose; and generally relating to a course
8 on peace and conflict studies in public high schools.

11 Section 7–205.5 and 7–452

12 Annotated Code of Maryland

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

15 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 **Article – Education**

17 **7–205.5.**

18 **(A) (1) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL DEVELOP CURRICULUM CONTENT**
19 **STANDARDS FOR A COURSE ON PEACE AND CONFLICT STUDIES FOR HIGH SCHOOL**
20 **STUDENTS IN THE STATE.**

21 **(2) THE PEACE AND CONFLICT STUDIES CURRICULUM CONTENT**
22 **STANDARDS SHALL:**

1 **(I) ENABLE STUDENTS TO NAVIGATE CONFLICTS AND ENGAGE**
2 **IN PRODUCTIVE CONVERSATIONS THROUGH INSTRUCTION ON THE FOLLOWING**
3 **SKILLS:**

4 1. **ACTIVE LISTENING;**

5 2. **MEDIATION; AND**

6 3. **NEGOTIATION;**

7 **(II) INCLUDE INSTRUCTION ON THE FOLLOWING TOPICS:**

8 1. **CYBERSECURITY;**

9 2. **ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE;**

10 3. **HISTORY;**

11 4. **INTERNATIONAL STUDIES;**

12 5. **LAW AND CRIMINAL JUSTICE;**

13 6. **PEACE ENGINEERING;**

14 7. **PHILOSOPHY;**

15 8. **SOCIAL WORK;**

16 9. **TECHNOLOGY; AND**

17 10. **ANY OTHER TOPICS THAT PROVIDE STUDENTS WITH**
18 **AN UNDERSTANDING OF THE CAUSES AND EFFECTS OF CONFLICTS; AND**

19 **(III) REQUIRE COMPLETION OF AT LEAST 8 STUDENT SERVICE**
20 **HOURS DEDICATED TO CONFLICT RESOLUTION TRAINING AND RELATED ACTIVITIES.**

21 **(B) (1) BEGINNING IN THE 2024–2025 SCHOOL YEAR, EACH COUNTY**
22 **BOARD SHALL IMPLEMENT A COURSE ON PEACE AND CONFLICT STUDIES USING THE**
23 **CURRICULUM CONTENT STANDARDS DEVELOPED BY THE DEPARTMENT UNDER**
24 **SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION IN EACH PUBLIC HIGH SCHOOL IN THE COUNTY.**

25 **(2) THE COURSE ON PEACE AND CONFLICT STUDIES SHALL BE**
26 **TAUGHT BY A CERTIFIED MEDIATOR WHO HAS CONFLICT RESOLUTION SKILLS.**

1 **(3) (I) A HIGH SCHOOL MAY ESTABLISH PARTNERSHIPS WITH**
2 **COMMUNITY REMEDIATION CENTERS TO ASSIST STUDENTS IN COMPLETING THE**
3 **STUDENT SERVICE HOURS REQUIREMENT OF THE COURSE.**

4 **(II) THE STUDENT SERVICE HOURS REQUIRED UNDER**
5 **SUBSECTION (A)(2)(III) OF THIS SECTION SHALL COUNT TOWARD A STUDENT'S**
6 **SERVICE HOURS GRADUATION REQUIREMENT.**

7 **(C) EACH COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT SHALL ENSURE COMPLIANCE WITH**
8 **THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION.**

9 **(D) THE STATE BOARD MAY ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT THIS**
10 **SECTION.**

11 **7-452.**

12 **(A) IN THIS SECTION, "MEDIATOR" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS TRAINED**
13 **IN FACILITATING NEGOTIATIONS AND COMMUNICATIONS BETWEEN DISPUTING**
14 **PARTIES TO RESOLVE CONFLICTS.**

15 **(B) BEGINNING IN THE 2024-2025 SCHOOL YEAR, EACH PUBLIC HIGH**
16 **SCHOOL IN THE STATE SHALL HAVE A MEDIATOR TO PROVIDE EDUCATION AND**
17 **SUPPORT TO STUDENTS AND SCHOOL PERSONNEL RELATING TO CONFLICT**
18 **RESOLUTION AND PEACEFUL COMMUNICATIONS IN RESOLVING DISPUTES ARISING**
19 **AT THE HIGH SCHOOL, INCLUDING THROUGH:**

20 **(1) WORKSHOPS;**

21 **(2) TRAINING; AND**

22 **(3) ONE-ON-ONE SUPPORT TO INDIVIDUALS IN CONFLICT.**

23 **(C) FOR EACH FISCAL YEAR, THE GOVERNOR SHALL INCLUDE IN THE**
24 **ANNUAL BUDGET BILL AN APPROPRIATION IN AN AMOUNT SUFFICIENT TO EMPLOY**
25 **AND TRAIN MEDIATORS IN EACH PUBLIC HIGH SCHOOL IN THE STATE.**

26 **SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July**
27 **1, 2023.**
