A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Maryland–Ireland Trade Commission – Establishment**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland–Ireland Trade Commission in the
4 Department of Commerce to study and make recommendations regarding certain
5 trade relations between Maryland and Ireland; and generally relating to the
6 Maryland–Ireland Trade Commission.

7 BY adding to

8 Article – Economic Development

9 Section 5–2501 through 5–2504 to be under the new subtitle “Subtitle 25.
10 Maryland–Ireland Trade Commission”

11 Annotated Code of Maryland

13 Preamble

14 WHEREAS, Over 9% of Maryland’s population is of Irish descent; and

15 WHEREAS, The ties that bind Ireland to Maryland are deep and lasting; and

16 WHEREAS, Irish heritage has been the fortunate lot of many great Marylanders;

1 WHEREAS, Ireland and Maryland are attempting to reinvent their economies for
2 success in the twenty-first century; and

3 WHEREAS, Marylanders have both historic and practical reasons to desire the
4 building of firmer commercial links with Ireland; now, therefore,

5 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
6 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

7 **Article – Economic Development**

8 **SUBTITLE 25. MARYLAND–IRELAND TRADE COMMISSION.**

9 **5–2501.**

10 **IN THIS SUBTITLE, “COMMISSION” MEANS THE MARYLAND–IRELAND TRADE**
11 **COMMISSION.**

12 **5–2502.**

13 **(A) THERE IS A MARYLAND–IRELAND TRADE COMMISSION IN THE**
14 **DEPARTMENT.**

15 **(B) THE PURPOSE OF THE COMMISSION IS TO STUDY AND PROMOTE TRADE**
16 **BETWEEN MARYLAND AND IRELAND.**

17 **5–2503.**

18 **(A) THE COMMISSION CONSISTS OF THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS:**

19 **(1) THE SECRETARY, OR THE SECRETARY’S DESIGNEE;**

20 **(2) THE SECRETARY OF STATE, OR THE SECRETARY OF STATE’S**
21 **DESIGNEE;**

22 **(3) TWO MEMBERS OF THE SENATE OF MARYLAND, APPOINTED BY**
23 **THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE, WHO HAVE KNOWLEDGE OF ORGANIZATIONS THAT**
24 **PROMOTE IRISH AFFAIRS, OR CURRENT OR PAST INVOLVEMENT IN ORGANIZATIONS**
25 **THAT PROMOTE IRISH AFFAIRS, OR HAVE AN INTEREST IN THE WELL–BEING OF**
26 **TRADE RELATIONS BETWEEN MARYLAND AND IRELAND;**

27 **(4) TWO MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, APPOINTED BY**
28 **THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE, WHO HAVE KNOWLEDGE OF ORGANIZATIONS THAT**
29 **PROMOTE IRISH AFFAIRS, OR CURRENT OR PAST INVOLVEMENT IN ORGANIZATIONS**

1 THAT PROMOTE IRISH AFFAIRS, OR HAVE AN INTEREST IN THE WELL-BEING OF
2 TRADE RELATIONS BETWEEN MARYLAND AND IRELAND; AND

3 (5) THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS, APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR,
4 WITH THE ADVICE AND CONSENT OF THE SENATE:

5 (I) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF A PUBLIC INSTITUTION OF
6 HIGHER EDUCATION;

7 (II) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE MARYLAND CHAMBER OF
8 COMMERCE OR ITS SUCCESSOR ORGANIZATION; AND

9 (III) TWO REPRESENTATIVES OF THE IRISH-AMERICAN
10 COMMUNITY, WHO MAY NOT BE OF THE SAME POLITICAL PARTY.

11 (B) THE CHAIR AND VICE CHAIR OF THE COMMISSION SHALL BE ELECTED
12 FROM AMONG THE MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION.

13 (C) A MEMBER OF THE BOARD:

14 (1) MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION AS A MEMBER OF THE BOARD;
15 BUT

16 (2) IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE
17 STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.

18 (D) (1) THE TERM OF AN APPOINTED MEMBER IS 4 YEARS.

19 (2) THE TERMS OF THE APPOINTED MEMBERS ARE STAGGERED AS
20 REQUIRED BY THE TERMS PROVIDED FOR MEMBERS ON OCTOBER 1, 2024.

21 (3) AT THE END OF A TERM, A MEMBER CONTINUES TO SERVE UNTIL
22 A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED AND QUALIFIES.

23 (4) A MEMBER WHO IS APPOINTED AFTER A TERM HAS BEGUN SERVES
24 ONLY FOR THE REST OF THE TERM UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED AND
25 QUALIFIES.

26 (5) THE GOVERNOR MAY REMOVE AN APPOINTED MEMBER FOR
27 INCOMPETENCE, MISCONDUCT, OR FAILURE TO PERFORM THE DUTIES OF THE
28 POSITION.

1 **(A) THE COMMISSION SHALL STUDY AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS**
2 **REGARDING:**

3 **(1) ADVANCING BILATERAL TRADE AND INVESTMENT BETWEEN**
4 **MARYLAND AND IRELAND;**

5 **(2) INITIATING JOINT ACTION ON POLICY ISSUES OF MUTUAL**
6 **INTEREST TO MARYLAND AND IRELAND;**

7 **(3) PROMOTING BUSINESS AND ACADEMIC EXCHANGES BETWEEN**
8 **MARYLAND AND IRELAND;**

9 **(4) ENCOURAGING MUTUAL ECONOMIC SUPPORT BETWEEN**
10 **MARYLAND AND IRELAND;**

11 **(5) ENCOURAGING MUTUAL INVESTMENT IN THE INFRASTRUCTURE**
12 **OF MARYLAND AND IRELAND; AND**

13 **(6) OTHER ISSUES AS DETERMINED BY THE COMMISSION.**

14 **(B) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1, 2025, AND EACH DECEMBER 1**
15 **THEREAFTER, THE COMMISSION SHALL REPORT ITS FINDINGS AND**
16 **RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1257 OF**
17 **THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.**

18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

19 (a) All initial appointments to the Maryland–Ireland Trade Commission shall be
20 made not later than February 1, 2025.

21 (b) The terms of the initial appointed members of the Maryland–Ireland Trade
22 Commission shall expire as follows:

23 (1) two members in 2025; and

24 (2) two members in 2026.

25 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
26 October 1, 2024.
