1 AN ACT concerning

Environment - Commission on Environmental Justice and Sustainable Communities - Reform

4 FOR the purpose of altering the membership of the Commission on Environmental Justice $\mathbf{5}$ and Sustainable Communities; requiring the membership of the Commission to 6 reflect the diversity of the State to the extent practicable; specifying the term of 7 certain members; requiring the Department of the Environment to provide a new 8 member with a certain orientation; altering the manner in which a chair is chosen 9 for the Commission; requiring the Commission to meet a minimum number of times 10 per calendar year; requiring the Commission to hold a certain number of meetings 11 in certain locations of the State; requiring the Commission's meetings to be 12reasonably accessible to all attendees, including certain persons; requiring the 13Department to post notice of the time and location of its meetings on its website at least a certain number of days before the meeting; prohibiting a member of the 14 15Commission from representing more than one entity or group; requiring the 16Commission to use data sets and mapping tools to review and analyze the current impact of State and local laws, permits, actions, and policies on certain issues; 1718 requiring the Commission to assess compliance with a certain federal law; requiring 19the Maryland Office of Minority Health and Health Disparities and the Commission 20to coordinate with the Commission on Climate Change on certain recommendations; 21repealing the requirement that the Commission develop certain criteria; requiring 22the Commission, after seeking to seek input from and hosting host meetings in 23certain communities, to create a list of potential supplemental environmental 24projects to address environmental justice issues; requiring the Commission to 25recommend certain options to the General Assembly; defining certain terms; and

8 (3) Assess the adequacy of State and local government laws to address the 9 issue of environmental justice and sustainable communities, INCLUDING ASSESSING 10 <u>COMPLIANCE WITH TITLE VI OF THE FEDERAL CIVIL RIGHTS ACT OF 1964;</u>

11 (4) Coordinate with the Children's Environmental Health and Protection 12 Advisory Council, THE MARYLAND OFFICE OF MINORITY HEALTH AND HEALTH 13 <u>DISPARITIES</u>, AND THE COMMISSION ON CLIMATE CHANGE on recommendations 14 related to environmental justice and sustainable communities;

(i) On or before October 1 of each year, the Commission shall report its findings
and recommendations to the Governor and, subject to § 2–1257 of the State Government
Article, the General Assembly.

28 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 29 October 1, 2021.
