Board of Restorative Practices in Schools - Establishment

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Board of Restorative Practices in Schools; providing 4 for the composition, chair, and staffing of the Board; providing for the term of 5 selected members of the Board; providing for the staggering of the terms of selected 6 members of the Board; establishing that, at the end of a term, a selected member 7 continues to serve until a successor is appointed and qualifies; providing that a 8 majority of the authorized membership of the Board is a quorum; requiring the Board 9 to meet a certain number of times each year; prohibiting a member of the Board from 10 receiving certain compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain 11 expenses; requiring the Board to study, monitor, and make recommendations 12 regarding certain matters; requiring the Board to report its findings and 13 recommendations to the General Assembly on or before a certain date each year; 14 defining a certain term; and generally relating to the Board of Restorative Practices in Schools. 15
