Pharmacists - Status as Health Care Providers and Reimbursement

- 3 FOR the purpose of altering certain definitions of "health care provider" to include 4 pharmacists for the purposes of provisions of law related to health care malpractice 5 claims and HIV testing; requiring the Maryland Medical Assistance Program, the 6 Maryland Children's Health Program, and certain insurers, nonprofit health service 7 plans, and health maintenance organizations to provide coverage for certain services 8 rendered by a licensed pharmacist if the coverage is provided for the same services 9 rendered by any other health care practitioner and the services are within the scope 10 of practice of the licensed pharmacist; and generally relating to pharmacists.

- 20 (a) This section applies to individual, group, or blanket health insurance policies 21 and contracts delivered or issued for delivery in the State by insurers, nonprofit health 22 service plans, and health maintenance organizations [that provide coverage for patient 23 assessment regarding, and administration of, self-administered medications, maintenance 24 injectable medications, and injectable medications for treatment of sexually transmitted 25 infections].
- 26 (b) An entity subject to this section shall provide coverage for services rendered 27 by a licensed pharmacist [under § 12–509 of the Health Occupations Article] to an 28 individual who is covered under a policy or contract issued or delivered by the entity, [to 29 the same extent as] IF:
- 30 (1) COVERAGE IS PROVIDED UNDER THE POLICY OR CONTRACT FOR
 31 THE SAME services rendered by any other licensed health care practitioner [, for patient
 32 assessment regarding and in administering self-administered medications, maintenance

- 1 injectable medications, or injectable medications for treatment of sexually transmitted
- 2 infections]; AND
- 3 (2) THE SERVICES ARE WITHIN THE SCOPE OF PRACTICE OF THE 4 LICENSED PHARMACIST.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, to implement § 15–148(c) of the Health – General Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act, on or before January 1, 2024, the Maryland Department of Health shall apply for and obtain from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services any necessary amendments to or waivers for the Maryland Medical Assistance Program or the Maryland Children's Health Program.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 11 October 1, 2023.
