A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **General Provisions – Commemorative Months – Maryland Sportsmanship**
3 **Month**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Governor annually to proclaim a certain month as
5 Maryland Sportsmanship Month; requiring the proclamation to urge local recreation
6 and parks departments to observe Maryland Sportsmanship Month with certain
7 programs, ceremonies, and activities; specifying certain examples of appropriate
8 programs, ceremonies, and activities; and generally relating to Maryland
9 Sportsmanship Month.

1 WHEREAS, Sports can be a vehicle for physical fitness and positive personal growth;
2 and

3 WHEREAS, Those involved in sports, including coaches, players, and fans at all
4 levels, should promote good sportsmanship and foster the development of positive
5 characteristics in all individuals; and

6 WHEREAS, Players will have an equal opportunity to strive for success and can
7 trust that they will be treated with dignity; and

8 WHEREAS, Elements of sportsmanship reflect crucial life skills that will help
9 players thrive throughout elementary, secondary, and postsecondary education; and

10 WHEREAS, A strong sense of character and collaboration can also prepare athletes
11 for the workplace; and

12 WHEREAS, Sportsmanship can combat bullying and promote inclusion by providing
13 a safe and healthy environment where players value respect, fairness, integrity,
14 responsibility, and perseverance; and

15 WHEREAS, Respect is treating others the way you want to be treated, tolerating
16 differences, considering the feelings of others, dealing peacefully with anger, insults, and
17 disagreements, and taking care of the environment; and

18 WHEREAS, Fairness is playing by the rules, being open-minded, listening to others,
19 not taking advantage of others, and taking personal responsibility for mistakes; and

20 WHEREAS, Integrity is playing with honor, being humble in victory and graceful in
21 defeat, being truthful and trustworthy, having the courage to do the right thing, being
22 reliable, building a good reputation, and being loyal to your team and coaches; and

23 WHEREAS, Responsibility is doing what is expected of you, being self-disciplined,
24 thinking before you act, considering the consequences of your actions, and being
25 accountable for your choices; and

26 WHEREAS, Perseverance is always doing your best, demonstrating a positive
27 attitude, and never giving up; and

28 WHEREAS, Fostering these qualities on the playing field can prevent harassment
29 and reduce incidents of concussions and other injuries; and

30 WHEREAS, Those who demonstrate sportsmanship are invaluable because they
31 create a domino effect by setting a positive tone for others to emulate in their schools and
32 communities; and

33 WHEREAS, A positive tone can increase the rankings of our schools, enhance the
34 atmosphere of our municipalities, and serve as a conduit for economic development,

1 drawing businesses to our State; and

2 WHEREAS, A number of local recreation and parks departments across the State
3 have successfully implemented sportsmanship months at the local level; and

4 WHEREAS, It is critical that good sportsmanship be developed and recognized in
5 order to ensure a quality sports environment for all involved; now, therefore,

6 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
7 That Section(s) 7-503 through 7-506, respectively, of Article – General Provisions of the
8 Annotated Code of Maryland be renumbered to be Section(s) 7-504 through 7-507,
9 respectively.

10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland read
11 as follows:

12 **Article – General Provisions**

13 **7-503.**

14 **(A) THE GOVERNOR ANNUALLY SHALL PROCLAIM THE MONTH OF MARCH**
15 **AS MARYLAND SPORTSMANSHIP MONTH.**

16 **(B) (1) THE PROCLAMATION SHALL URGE LOCAL RECREATION AND**
17 **PARKS DEPARTMENTS IN THE STATE TO OBSERVE MARYLAND SPORTSMANSHIP**
18 **MONTH PROPERLY WITH APPROPRIATE PROGRAMS, CEREMONIES, AND ACTIVITIES.**

19 **(2) APPROPRIATE PROGRAMS, CEREMONIES, AND ACTIVITIES MAY**
20 **INCLUDE:**

21 **(I) RECOGNITION OF PLAYERS, PARENTS, COACHES, AND**
22 **VOLUNTEERS WHO HAVE DEMONSTRATED EXEMPLARY SPORTSMANSHIP IN LOCAL**
23 **ATHLETIC ACTIVITIES;**

24 **(II) SKILL DEVELOPMENT SESSIONS FOR PLAYERS;**

25 **(III) CERTIFICATION AND TRAINING SESSIONS FOR COACHES;**

26 **AND**

27 **(IV) RECOGNITION OF VOLUNTEER CONTRIBUTIONS AND**
28 **PARENT COMMITMENTS THAT ARE KEY TO PROVIDING EVERY CHILD A CHANCE TO**
29 **EXPERIENCE SPORTS.**

30 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
31 October 1, 2018.
