A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **State Department of Education – Breakfast and Lunch Programs – Funding**
3 **(Free School Meals for Students From Low– and Middle–Income Families Act)**

4 FOR the purpose of repealing the requirement that the State Board of Education adopt and
5 publish standards for the administration of a subsidized feeding program; requiring
6 the State to be responsible for the student share of the costs of certain meals;
7 prohibiting a county board of education from charging certain students for any
8 portion of the cost of a meal; making conforming changes; and generally relating to
9 school breakfast and lunch programs and the State Department of Education.

10 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

12 Section 7–601 through 7–605 and 7–701 through 7–703
13 Annotated Code of Maryland
14 (2014 Replacement Volume and 2015 Supplement)

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
16 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 **Article – Education**

18 7–601.

19 (a) The State Board shall adopt and publish standards for the administration of
20 the [subsidized and] free feeding program.

21 (b) The standards shall[:

1 (1) Provide] **PROVIDE** for eligibility requirements for the program[; and

2 (2) Require each county board to provide a reduced price lunch program].

3 7-602.

4 (a) There is a State Free Feeding Program.

5 (b) (1) Each year the State Superintendent shall determine the amount of
6 State money required to provide a [program of subsidized and] free feeding [programs]
7 **PROGRAM** in accordance with the standards adopted by the State Board under this
8 subtitle.

9 (2) The amount included for this Program in the annual State budget,
10 including any federal funds, and as submitted to and appropriated by the General
11 Assembly, shall be distributed to the county boards under § 5-212 of this article.

12 (c) **THE STATE SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE STUDENT SHARE OF THE**
13 **COSTS OF:**

14 (1) **BREAKFASTS PROVIDED TO ALL STUDENTS ELIGIBLE FOR A**
15 **REDUCED PRICE BREAKFAST UNDER THE FEDERAL SCHOOL BREAKFAST PROGRAM;**
16 **AND**

17 (2) **LUNCHES PROVIDED TO ALL STUDENTS ELIGIBLE FOR A**
18 **REDUCED PRICE LUNCH UNDER THE NATIONAL SCHOOL LUNCH PROGRAM.**

19 (d) **A COUNTY BOARD MAY NOT CHARGE A STUDENT WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR**
20 **A REDUCED PRICE BREAKFAST OR LUNCH FOR ANY PORTION OF THE COST OF A**
21 **MEAL.**

22 7-603.

23 Each public school in this State shall provide a [program of subsidized or] free
24 feeding [programs] **PROGRAM** for children who meet the standards adopted by the State
25 Board under this subtitle.

26 7-604.

27 Funds appropriated for the [subsidized or] free feeding program shall be used to
28 reimburse each county board for the difference between costs and all available
29 reimbursements and other funds[, including the amounts paid by children].

30 7-605.

1 (a) The General Assembly finds the following policies desirable in the
2 administration and application of the school feeding [programs] **PROGRAM**:

3 (1) Private organizations and corporations should be encouraged to
4 participate in the program;

5 (2) The identity of children who participate in **THE** free [or subsidized]
6 feeding [programs] **PROGRAM** should remain anonymous and positive procedures should
7 be adopted to accomplish this; and

8 (3) Applications for participants in the program should be brief and simple,
9 based on a statement of present income and family size or of participation in a social
10 services or welfare program.

11 (b) There may not be discrimination [among these programs] **IN THIS PROGRAM**
12 for elementary, junior high, and high school students.

13 7-701.

14 (a) The State Board shall require each county board to provide in each elementary
15 school a free [and reduced price] breakfast, unless the school is exempted under § 7-702 of
16 this subtitle.

17 (b) The free [and reduced price] breakfast required to be provided under this
18 section shall meet the standards of the United States Department of Agriculture.

19 7-702.

20 The State Superintendent shall exempt any elementary school from the
21 requirements of this subtitle if:

22 (1) (i) The school has made a breakfast program available for at least 3
23 consecutive months; and

24 (ii) The participation is less than 25 percent of the number of
25 students eligible for free and reduced price **ELIGIBLE** meals in each month;

26 (2) (i) The county board approves an alternative nutrition program that
27 the school has instituted;

28 (ii) The school regularly conducts an assessment of the alternative
29 program that provides evidence of success in achieving program objectives; and

30 (iii) The school submits an annual report of the assessment to the
31 county board and the State;

1 (3) (i) The school requests an exemption for reasons of a compelling
2 nature to the county board; and

3 (ii) After review and approval, the county board submits the request
4 for exemption to the State Superintendent; or

5 (4) (i) The school has less than 15 percent of its enrollment approved
6 for free and reduced price **ELIGIBLE** meals.

7 (ii) This exemption shall continue from year to year without the need
8 for reapplication, until there is a 10 percent increase in the number of students approved
9 for free and reduced price **ELIGIBLE** meals.

10 7–703.

11 (a) The free [and reduced price] breakfast program under this subtitle shall be
12 suspended if the per meal reimbursement that the federal government provides for the
13 breakfast program is:

14 (1) Reduced below the rate prescribed on July 1, [1979] **2013**; or

15 (2) Adjusted by the Secretary of the United States Department of
16 Agriculture, as of the most recent July 1 under the national Child Nutrition Act, and the
17 per meal reimbursement is below the adjusted rate.

18 (b) The reimbursement for each meal under subsection (a) of this section shall be
19 determined as follows:

20 (1) Multiply the number of reduced price **ELIGIBLE** breakfasts served
21 statewide times the federal reimbursement rate for those breakfasts;

22 (2) Multiply the number of free breakfasts served statewide times the
23 federal reimbursement rate for those breakfasts; and

24 (3) Divide the total of paragraphs (1) and (2) of this subsection by the total
25 number of free and reduced price **ELIGIBLE** breakfasts.

26 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
27 1, 2016.
