A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Vehicle Laws - Fleeing or Eluding Police

3 FOR the purpose of making it a felony for a driver of a vehicle to attempt, in a certain 4 manner, to elude a police officer who gives the driver a visual or an audible 5 signal to stop and the driver's actions pose a risk of imminent bodily injury to, 6 result in bodily injury to, or result in the death of another person; altering the 7 law to prohibit a driver who has been given a visual or an audible signal to stop 8 by a police officer from attempting to elude the police officer in a manner that 9 poses a risk of imminent bodily injury to another person; providing an exception to the prohibition against attempting to elude a police officer under certain 10 circumstances to allow a driver who has been given a visual or an audible 11 12 signal to stop by the police officer in an appropriately marked police vehicle to 13 proceed directly to a police station or any other public area before stopping; defining certain terms; altering a certain definition; making conforming 14 changes; and generally relating to eluding police officers by drivers of vehicles 15 16 under certain circumstances.

- 22 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

3 4	(2) "APPROPRIATELY MARKED POLICE VEHICLE" MEANS AN OFFICIAL POLICE VEHICLE DISPLAYING:
5 6 7	(I) THE OFFICIAL EMBLEM OR INSIGNIA OF A POLICE OR SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT OF THE STATE OR A COUNTY OR MUNICIPALITY IN THE STATE;
8 9	(II) THE OFFICIAL EMBLEM OR INSIGNIA OF THE STATE OR A COUNTY OR MUNICIPALITY IN THE STATE; OR
10	(III) 1. AN ACTIVATED SIREN; AND

18 19 20 21	(b) If a police officer gives a visual SIGNAL or AN audible signal to stop and the police officer is in uniform, prominently displaying the police officer's badge or other insignia of office, a driver of a vehicle may not attempt to elude the police officer by:

23	(2) Fleeing on foot; or
24	(3) Any other means.
25 26 27 28	(c) If a police officer gives a visual SIGNAL or AN audible signal to stop and the police officer, whether or not in uniform, is in [a vehicle] AN appropriately marked [as an official] police vehicle, a driver of a vehicle may not attempt to elude the police officer by:
29	(1) Willfully failing to stop the driver's vehicle UNLESS, WHILE

OBEYING TRAFFIC LAWS, THE DRIVER PROCEEDS DIRECTLY TO A NEARBY

$1\\2$	POLICE STATION OR ANY OTHER LIGHTED PUBLIC LOCATION TO STOP THE DRIVER'S VEHICLE;
3	(2) Fleeing on foot; or
4	(3) Any other means.
5 6 7	(d) (1) A driver may not commit a violation of subsection (b)(1) or (c)(1) of this section that POSES A RISK OF IMMINENT BODILY INJURY OR results in bodily injury to another person.
8 9	(2) A driver may not commit a violation of subsection (b)(1) or (c)(1) of this section that results in death of another person.
10	(3) A VIOLATION OF THIS SUBSECTION IS A FELONY.
11 12	(e) (1) In this subsection, "crime of violence" has the meaning stated in $\$ 14–101 of the Criminal Law Article.
13 14 15 16	(2) A driver may not commit a violation of subsection (b)(1) or (c)(1) of this section while the driver is attempting to elude a police officer who is signaling for the driver to stop for the purpose of apprehending the driver for the commission of a crime of violence for which the driver is subsequently convicted.
