A BILL ENTITLED

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Department of the Environment – Office of Recycling – Recycling Market Development

- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Office of Recycling in the Department of the Environment 5 to develop markets for recycled materials and recycled products in the State in a 6 certain manner; requiring the Office to report to the General Assembly on or before 7 a certain date each year; requiring the Office to coordinate certain activities with 8 certain entities; prohibiting the Department of the Environment from employing 9 more than a certain number of staff to carry out the requirements of this Act; requiring the Department of Commerce, the Department of General Services, the 10 11 Department of Transportation, and the Maryland Environmental Service to report 12 to the Office on certain information available to promote the development of markets 13 for recycled material and recycled products; altering the contents of a certain report; declaring the intent of the General Assembly; defining a certain term; and generally 14 relating to markets for recycled materials and recycled products in the State. 15

3 4	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 28 (B) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1, 2021, AND EACH YEAR THEREAFTER, THE
- 29 OFFICE SHALL REPORT TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, IN ACCORDANCE WITH §
- 30 2-1257 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, ON THE ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED
- 31 UNDER THIS SECTION.

- THE OFFICE SHALL COORDINATE ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED UNDER THIS 1 (C) 2 SECTION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE, THE DEPARTMENT OF GENERAL 3 SERVICES, THE **DEPARTMENT** \mathbf{OF} TRANSPORTATION, THE **MARYLAND** ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICE, THE NORTHEAST WASTE DISPOSAL AUTHORITY, 4 LOCAL GOVERNMENTS, AND PRIVATE ORGANIZATIONS. 5
 - (D) THE DEPARTMENT MAY NOT EMPLOY MORE THAN ONE STAFF MEMBER TO CARRY OUT THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION.

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- 8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That on or before July 1, 2021, the 9 Department of Commerce, the Department of General Services, the Department of 10 Transportation, and the Maryland Environmental Service shall report to the Office of 11 Recycling in the Department of the Environment on relevant programs, tools, training 12 guides, campaigns, and technologies available for promoting the development of markets for recycled materials and recycled products in the State, including efforts in State 13 14 government to increase the use, reuse, and remanufacturing of recycled materials and the 15 use of recycled products.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That it is the intent of the General Assembly that the Office of Recycling in the Department of the Environment seek input from all interested parties to develop a comprehensive understanding of the programs, tools, training guides, and technologies available to promote the development of markets for recycled materials and recycled products in the State.
- SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2020.
