- 17 (a) In this section, "mutilated" includes any imperfection of or in a driver's license, after its issuance, that renders it unsuitable for identification purposes or for verifying its
- 19 authenticity and validity.
- 20 (b) If a driver's license is lost, stolen, mutilated, or destroyed, the licensee
- 21 immediately shall apply for and, after furnishing information satisfactory to the
- 22 Administration and payment of the required fee, is entitled to obtain a duplicate license. If
- 23 the duplicate license being applied for is of a type requiring a photo and the licensee is
- 24 temporarily absent from this State, the Administration may issue a regular license bearing

- the notation that it is valid without a photo until 15 days after the licensee first returns to this State.
- 3 (c) A licensee who is at least 21 years may apply for a duplicate license that 4 includes a frontal photograph of the licensee.
- 5 (d) If a person recovers an original license for which a duplicate has been issued, 6 the person promptly shall surrender the original license to the Administration.
- 7 (E) IF A VICTIM OF A ROBBERY OR THEFT WHOSE LICENSE IS TAKEN DURING
 8 THE ROBBERY OR THEFT PRESENTS A POLICE REPORT OF THE ROBBERY OR THEFT
 9 WHEN APPLYING FOR A DUPLICATE LICENSE, THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL ISSUE A
 10 DUPLICATE LICENSE FREE OF CHARGE.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2019.
