BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Education Section 7-401 Annotated Code of Maryland (2022 Replacement Volume and 2024 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Education 7-401.(a) With the assistance of the county health department, each county board shall provide:

- 9 (4) The Department shall conduct at least two meetings annually with all school health services program coordinators in the State.
- [(d)] (E) On or before December 1, 2015, and every 5 years thereafter, the Department shall report to the Governor and, subject to § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, to the General Assembly a summary of the information reported to the State Superintendent during the COMAR certification process.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 16 1, 2025.
