

13 14	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 6 (b) An applicant is entitled to receive a provisional license if the applicant:
- 7 (1) Meets the minimum age required under § 16–103(c)(2) of this subtitle;
- 8 (2) Satisfies the learner's instructional permit requirements under § 9 16–105(d)(2), (3), [or] (4), OR (5) of this subtitle;
- 10 (3) Passes a driver skills or driver road examination administered under 11 this subtitle;
- 12 (4) Surrenders any learner's instructional permit issued to the applicant; 13 and
- 14 (5) Pays the fee established under this subtitle.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 16 October 1, 2017.
