BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Alcoholic Beverages Section 2–206 Annotated Code of Maryland (2016 Volume and 2022 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Alcoholic Beverages 2-206.(a) There is a Class 4 limited winery license. (b) (1) A license holder may:



- 4 (I) IS ALSO LICENSED TO OPERATE A FOOD ESTABLISHMENT 5 UNDER TITLE 21, SUBTITLE 3 OF THE HEALTH GENERAL ARTICLE; AND
- 6 (II) MEETS THE SAME RATIO OF GROSS RECEIPTS BETWEEN

- 17 (i) for off–premises consumption of wine and pomace brandy and for sampling, from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m. each day; and
- 19 (ii) for on-premises consumption of wine and pomace brandy and 20 sales and service of food on the licensed premises:
- 21 1. from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. each day; or
- 22 2. if guests are attending a planned promotional event or 23 other organized activity on the licensed premises, from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m. each day.
- [(8)] (9) Except as provided in Division II of this article, the license allows the license holder to operate 7 days a week.
- [(9) At least 14 days before holding a planned promotional event after 6 p.m., a license holder shall file a notice of the promotional event with the Comptroller on the form that the Comptroller provides.]
- 29 (10) Nothing in this subsection limits the application of relevant provisions 30 of Title 21 of the Health General Article, and regulations adopted under that title, to a 31 license holder.
- 32 (c) The place listed on the license shall be in compliance with \$ 1–405(b) of this 33 article.
