- 4 FOR the purpose of providing that a minor who, in good faith, seeks medical 5 assistance for another person who is experiencing a medical emergency after 6 ingesting alcohol or drugs may not be charged with or prosecuted for certain 7 crimes, be detained on an outstanding warrant for another nonviolent crime 8 under certain circumstances, or be required to provide any personal identifying 9 information for a certain purpose; creating a certain exception; and generally relating to the seeking of medical assistance for another person who ingested 10 alcohol or drugs. 11

- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 21 **(A)** The act of seeking medical assistance for another person who is 22 experiencing a medical emergency after ingesting alcohol or drugs may be used as a 23 mitigating factor in a criminal prosecution.

- (I) CHARGED WITH OR PROSECUTED FOR POSSESSION OF A CONTROLLED DANGEROUS SUBSTANCE UNDER § 5–601 OF THE CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE OR UNDERAGE POSSESSION OF ALCOHOL UNDER § 10–114 OF THE CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE IF THE EVIDENCE FOR THE CRIMINAL PROSECUTION WAS OBTAINED SOLELY AS A RESULT OF THE MINOR SEEKING MEDICAL ASSISTANCE;
- 10 (II) DETAINED ON AN OUTSTANDING WARRANT FOR 11 ANOTHER NONVIOLENT CRIME IF THE SEEKING OF MEDICAL ASSISTANCE BY 12 THE MINOR IS THE REASON FOR THE ENCOUNTER WITH LAW ENFORCEMENT; OR
- 13 (III) REQUIRED TO PROVIDE ANY PERSONAL IDENTIFYING 14 INFORMATION FOR ANY PURPOSE OTHER THAN ASSISTING IN THE MEDICAL 15 TREATMENT OF THE PERSON EXPERIENCING A MEDICAL EMERGENCY.
- 16 (2) THIS SUBSECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO A PERSON WHO
 17 PROVIDED, SOLD, GAVE, OR EXCHANGED FOR OTHER GOODS OR SERVICES THE
 18 ALCOHOL OR DRUGS CAUSING THE MEDICAL EMERGENCY TO THE PERSON FOR
 19 WHOM MEDICAL ASSISTANCE IS SOUGHT.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2014.
