A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Procurement – Veteran-Owned Small Business Enterprises – Participation Goal**

3 FOR the purpose of altering a certain participation goal for certain veteran-owned business
4 enterprises for certain procurement contracts; repealing obsolete language; and
5 generally relating to procurement participation by veteran-owned small business
6 enterprises.

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
13 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 **Article – State Finance and Procurement**

15 14-602.

16 (a) [Beginning July 1, 2012, a] **A** unit shall structure procurement procedures,
17 consistent with the purposes of this subtitle, to try to achieve an overall minimum of [0.5%]
18 **5%** of the unit's total dollar value of procurement contracts to be made directly or indirectly
19 with veteran-owned small business enterprises.

20 (b) Solicitation documents shall establish the expected degree of veteran-owned
21 small business enterprise participation based, in part, on:

1 (1) the potential subcontract opportunities available in the procurement
2 contract; and

3 (2) the availability of veteran–owned small business enterprises to respond
4 competitively to the potential subcontract opportunities.

5 (c) The provisions of this subtitle do not apply to a unit’s procurement procedures
6 to the extent that any unit determines that those provisions are in conflict with an
7 applicable federal program.

8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
9 October 1, 2015.
