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Video Lottery Operation Licenses – Information on Pa	ayouts
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3 FOR the purpose of requiring that regulations adopted by the State Lottery Commission include provisions that require certain payouts above certain 4 5 amounts be reported to the State Lottery Agency in a report that contains 6 certain information; requiring that the State Lottery Agency modify the report 7 in a certain manner and forward the modified report to the Department of Human Resources' Child Support Enforcement Administration for certain 8 9 purposes; and generally relating to video lottery terminal payouts and the 10 holding of a video lottery operation license.

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$\frac{1}{2}$	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
3	Article - State Government

5 6 7	(a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, the Commission shall ensure that a video lottery operation licensee complies with the requirements of this section as a condition of holding the video lottery operation license.
8 9	(f) In order to protect the public interest, the regulations shall include provisions that:
10 11	(1) limit the number and location of and maximum withdrawal amounts from automated teller machines;
12 13	(2) require payouts above an amount adopted by the Commission to be made by check;
14 15 16 17	(3) REQUIRE THAT PAYOUTS MADE BY CHECK ABOVE AN AMOUNT ADOPTED BY THE COMMISSION BE REPORTED TO THE STATE LOTTERY AGENCY IN A REPORT THAT CONTAINS THE NAME AND DATE OF BIRTH OF AN INDIVIDUAL AND THE AMOUNT OF THE PAYOUT;
18 19	[(3)] (4) require conspicuous disclosures related to the payout of video lottery terminals;
20 21	[(4)] (5) limit the dollar amount that video lottery terminals will accept;
22 23 24	[(5)] (6) prohibit the use of specified negotiable instruments at video lottery facilities and the use of credit cards, debit cards, and similar devices in video lottery terminals;
25 26 27	[(6)] (7) provide consumers with a record of video lottery terminal spending levels if marketing measures are utilized that track consumer spending at video lottery facilities;

contracting with another to engage in predatory marketing practices.

- ON RECEIPT OF THE REPORT REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION 1 (H) **(1)** 2(F)(3) OF THIS SECTION, THE STATE LOTTERY AGENCY SHALL MODIFY THE 3 REPORT TO INCLUDE ONLY THE NAMES OF INDIVIDUALS WHO HAVE BEEN CERTIFIED TO THE STATE LOTTERY AGENCY BY THE CHILD SUPPORT 4 ENFORCEMENT ADMINISTRATION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN 5 RESOURCES AS OBLIGORS WHO ARE IN ARREARS OF THEIR CHILD SUPPORT 6 7 ORDERS.
- 8 (2) THE STATE LOTTERY AGENCY SHALL FORWARD THE
  9 MODIFIED REPORT TO THE CHILD SUPPORT ENFORCEMENT ADMINISTRATION
  10 OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RESOURCES FOR THE PURPOSE OF
  11 ENFORCING CHILD SUPPORT ORDERS ISSUED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE
  12 APPLICABLE PROVISIONS OF THE FAMILY LAW ARTICLE.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2012.
