3 **Public Safety and Behavioral Health Surcharge – Reports**

5 FOR the purpose of altering the date by which the governing body of Prince George's County
6 is required to complete a certain report concerning the county's municipal tax setoffs;
7 altering the date by which the County Executive of Prince George's County is
8 required to prepare an annual report on a certain school facilities surcharge and a
9 certain public safety and behavioral health surcharge; and generally relating to
10 municipal tax setoffs, the school facilities surcharge, and the public safety and
11 behavioral health surcharge in Prince George's County.

8 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
9 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

10 **Article – Tax – Property**

11 6-305.

12 (k) (1) On or before [January 31] **OCTOBER 31** each year, the governing body
13 of Prince George's County shall complete a report that includes:

14 (i) the amount of the tax setoff granted to each municipal
15 corporation in the current fiscal year;

16 (ii) in the form provided by each municipal corporation, a detailed
17 description of the scope and nature of the individual services or programs provided by each
18 municipal corporation instead of similar services or programs provided by the county; and

19 (iii) a detailed description of the methodology used by the county to
20 determine the amount of the tax setoffs, including any formulas.

21 (2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the report required under
22 this subsection shall be:

23 (i) available to municipal corporations in Prince George's County on
24 request; and

25 (ii) submitted to the Prince George's County House Delegation and
26 the Prince George's County Senators.

27 **Article 17 – Prince George's County**

29 (h) The County Executive of Prince George's County shall prepare an annual
30 report on the school facilities surcharge on or before [August 31] **OCTOBER 31** of each year
31 for the County Council of Prince George's County, the Prince George's County Senate
32 Delegation, and the Prince George's County House Delegation, to include:

33 (1) A detailed description of how fees were expended; and

1 (2) The amount of fees collected.

3 (g) The County Executive of Prince George’s County shall prepare an annual
4 report on the public safety and behavioral health surcharge on or before [March 1]
5 **OCTOBER 31** of each year for the County Council of Prince George’s County, the Prince
6 George’s County Senate Delegation, and the Prince George’s County House Delegation, to
7 include:

8 (1) A detailed description of how the fees were expended; and

9 (2) The amount of fees collected.

10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
11 1, 2022.
