1 AN ACT concerning

2 Maryland Medical Assistance Program – Emergency Service Transporters 3 – Reimbursement

- FOR the purpose of altering the medical services provided by an emergency service 4 transporter for which the Maryland Department of Health is required to reimburse 5 6 the emergency service transporter who charges for its services and requests 7 reimbursement from the Maryland Medical Assistance Program; requiring the 8 Department to increase the amount of reimbursement by a certain amount each 9 fiscal year, beginning in a certain fiscal year, until the rate is at least a certain amount and pay at least the increased amount in each subsequent fiscal year; and 10 generally relating to the reimbursement of services provided by emergency service 11 12 transporters under the Maryland Medical Assistance Program.
