BY adding to Article - Education Section 5-324 Annotated Code of Maryland (2018 Replacement Volume and 2020 Supplement)

8 9 10	(3) EVALUATE THE INFRASTRUCTURE, INCLUDING SIDEWALK INFRASTRUCTURE, ALONG EXISTING AND POTENTIAL PEDESTRIAN OR CYCLIST ROUTES TO THE SCHOOL TO DETERMINE WHETHER INCREASED CAPACITY IS NECESSARY;
12 13	(4) ANALYZE EXISTING AND POTENTIAL SCHOOL ZONES, INCLUDING THE NEED FOR EXPANDING SCHOOL ZONES ON STATE AND COUNTY ROADS; AND
