## CHAPTER \_\_\_\_\_

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Teachers' Retirement and Pension Systems – Reemployment of**  
3 **Retirees – Clarification**

4 FOR the purpose of clarifying the number of retirees of the Teachers' Retirement System  
5 or the Teachers' Pension System that are exempt from a certain offset of a retirement  
6 allowance if they are reemployed in certain positions in a local school system or the  
7 Maryland School for the Deaf; and generally relating to the reemployment of retirees  
8 of the teachers' retirement and pension systems.

9 BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments,

11 Section 22–406(c)(4)(iv), (v), (vi), and (xi), (5), and (6) and 23–407(c)(4)(iv), (v), and

20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
21 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

**Article – State Personnel and Pensions**

22–406.

(c) (4) Except for an individual whose allowance is subject to a reduction as provided under paragraphs (1)(iii) and (3) of this subsection, the reduction of an allowance under this subsection does not apply to:

(iv) a retiree of the Teachers' Retirement System:

1. who retired and was reemployed by a participating employer other than the State on or before September 30, 1994; and

2. whose employment compensation does not derive, in whole or in part, from State funds;

(v) a retiree of the Teachers' Retirement System who:

1. is or has been certified to teach in the State;

2. has verification of satisfactory or better performance in the last assignment prior to retirement;

3. based on the retired teacher's qualifications, has been appointed in accordance with § 4–103 of the Education Article; and

4. receives verification of satisfactory or better performance each year the teacher is employed under paragraph (5) of this subsection;

(vi) a retiree of the Teachers' Retirement System who:

1. A. was employed as a principal within 5 years of retirement; or

B. was employed as a principal not more than 10 years before retirement and was employed in a position supervising principals in the retiree's last assignment prior to retirement;

2. has verification of satisfactory performance for each year as a principal and, if applicable, in a position supervising principals prior to retirement;

3. based on the retiree's qualifications, has been hired as a principal; and

4. receives verification of satisfactory performance each year the retiree is employed as a principal under paragraph (6) of this subsection;

1 (xi) a retiree of the Teachers' Retirement System who is reemployed  
2 by a local school system or the Maryland School for the Deaf and is rehired in accordance  
3 with subsection (c)(8) of this section.

20                   (8)    **(I) [Notwithstanding] IN ADDITION TO ANY INDIVIDUALS**  
21 **REHIRED IN ACCORDANCE WITH** paragraph (5) of this subsection, **AND SUBJECT TO**  
22 **SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH**, each superintendent of a local school system  
23 and the superintendent of the Maryland School for the Deaf may rehire a maximum of five  
24 individuals who are retirees of the Teachers' Pension System in any position at any school  
25 in the superintendent's local school system or the Maryland School for the Deaf.

26                   **(II) THE NUMBER OF INDIVIDUALS REHIRED UNDER**  
27 **SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF THIS PARAGRAPH FOR EACH LOCAL SCHOOL SYSTEM OR THE**  
28 **MARYLAND SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF MAY NOT EXCEED A TOTAL OF FIVE RETIREES**  
29 **AT ANY ONE TIME WHEN ADDED TO THE NUMBER OF INDIVIDUALS REHIRED UNDER**  
30 **§ 22-406(C)(8)(I) OF THIS ARTICLE FOR THAT SAME LOCAL SCHOOL SYSTEM OR THE**  
31 **MARYLAND SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF.**

32                   SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July  
33 1, 2016.
