1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Office of Legislative Audits – Audits of the Baltimore City Police Department**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Office of Legislative Audits to conduct a certain audit of
4 the Baltimore City Police Department within a certain time period and at certain
5 intervals; requiring the Office of Legislative Audits to provide certain information to
6 the Baltimore City Police Department; and generally relating to the audits of the
7 Baltimore City Police Department by the Office of Legislative Audits.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

14 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article – State Government**

16 2–1220.

17 **(H) (1) BEGINNING JULY 1, 2019, AND AT LEAST ONCE EVERY 6 YEARS**
18 **THEREAFTER, THE OFFICE OF LEGISLATIVE AUDITS SHALL CONDUCT AN AUDIT OF**
19 **THE BALTIMORE CITY POLICE DEPARTMENT TO EVALUATE THE EFFECTIVENESS**

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
7 October 1, 2018.
