CHAPTER

AN ACT concerning 1

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State Board of Physicians – Physicians, Physician Assistants, and Allied Health Practitioners - Licensure Requirements

FOR the purpose of authorizing the State Board of Physicians and a disciplinary panel to take certain actions against certain applicants and licensees for failing to submit to a certain criminal history records check; requiring certain applicants for licensure by the State Board of Physicians to submit to a certain criminal history records check; altering the circumstances under which certain individuals and certain physicians are authorized to practice medicine in the State without a license; requiring certain applicants and licensees to apply to the Criminal Justice Information System Central Repository of the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services for a certain criminal history records check and to submit to the Central Repository certain fingerprints and fees; requiring the Central Repository to forward to the Board and to certain individuals certain information under certain circumstances; providing that certain information is confidential, may not be redisseminated, and may be used only for certain purposes; authorizing certain individuals to contest certain information in accordance with certain provisions of law; altering the circumstances under which the Board may grant a certain waiver; requiring the Board, on receipt of certain information, to consider certain information in making certain determinations about certain applicants and licensees; requiring the Board to require certain criminal history records checks as a condition of license renewal beginning on a certain date; prohibiting the Board from


