Commission on African American Patriots in the American Revolutionary War

FOR the purpose of establishing the Commission on African American Patriots in the American Revolutionary War; providing for the composition, chair, staffing, and office space of the Commission; providing for the compensation of the chair of the Commission: providing that a member of the Commission is entitled to receive a certain stipend under certain circumstances; requiring that the staff provided to the Commission be adequately funded to perform certain duties; requiring the Commission, in consultation with certain persons, to conduct research to advance the documentation of African American patriots in the American Revolutionary War; requiring the Commission to determine and send to the county boards of education certain information; requiring the Commission to use certain research in determining the information to be sent to the county boards of education under a certain provision of this Act and in developing a certain publication; requiring the Commission to develop and print a certain publication; requiring the Governor to include certain funds in the annual budget bill for a certain fiscal year for certain purposes; requiring the Commission to assemble a certain inventory of sites; requiring the Commission to develop a plan to commemorate Maryland African American patriots in the American Revolutionary War through the placement of

SECTION $\frac{2}{3}$. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2018. It shall remain effective for a period of 5 years and, at the end of September 30, 2023, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
