- 1 (a) (1) In cooperation with the State Board and the Maryland State Medical Society, the Maryland Department of Health shall adopt rules and regulations regarding blood tests for lead poisoning required of children entering schools.
- 4 (2) [In] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN § 7–403.1 OF THIS SUBTITLE, IN 5 cooperation with the State Board and the Statewide Advisory Commission on 6 Immunizations, the Maryland Department of Health shall adopt rules and regulations 7 regarding immunizations required of children entering schools.
- 8 (3) These rules and regulations shall:
- 9 (i) Be adopted in compliance with the Administrative Procedure 10 Act;
- 11 (ii) Provide that any child may have the immunization administered 12 by his personal physician; and
- 13 (iii) 1. By September 2003, in areas designated as at risk for lead 14 poisoning, as determined under § 18–106 of the Health – General Article, when a child enters a public prekindergarten program, kindergarten program, or first grade, require the 15 16 parent or legal guardian of the child to provide documentation from a health care provider, 17 on a form developed by the Maryland Department of Health, certifying that the child has 18 undergone blood testing for lead poisoning administered in accordance with the guidelines 19 of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention in the screening of young children for 20 lead poisoning: Guidance for State and Local Public Health Officials (November 1997) and 21any subsequent guidelines; and
- 22 By September 2003, require a program or school to report 23 the name, last known address, and telephone number of each child for whom certified 24 documentation of a lead test is not provided under item 1 of this item, as determined by 25 regulation, to the local health department in the jurisdiction where the child resides.
- 26 (4) Any requirement for the administration of pertussis vaccine shall be consistent with § 18–332(b) of the Health General Article.

- 29 (A) EACH COUNTY BOARD SHALL TEMPORARILY ADMIT A STUDENT TO 30 SCHOOL IF THE STUDENT'S PARENT OR GUARDIAN IS UNABLE TO PROVIDE PROOF 31 OF IMMUNIZATION WITHIN THE TIME FRAME REQUIRED BY REGULATIONS ADOPTED 32 UNDER § 7–403 OF THIS SUBTITLE.

1	(1)	RECEIVE A REQUIRED IMMUNIZATION;
2	(2)	RECONSTRUCT A LOST RECORD; OR

- 3 (3) ACQUIRE EVIDENCE OF AGE-APPROPRIATE IMMUNITY ON A FORM 4 PROVIDED BY THE MARYLAND DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH.
- 5 (C) THE DATE OF THE STUDENT'S APPOINTMENT WITH A HEALTH 6 PROFESSIONAL OR LOCAL HEALTH DEPARTMENT MAY NOT EXCEED **60** CALENDAR 7 DAYS FROM THE DATE THE STUDENT IS GRANTED TEMPORARY ADMISSION.
- 8 **(D)** A PARENT OR GUARDIAN OF A TEMPORARILY ADMITTED STUDENT 9 SHALL PROVIDE EVIDENCE OF THE STUDENT'S REQUIRED IMMUNIZATIONS ON THE 10 NEXT SCHOOL DAY FOLLOWING THE STUDENT'S APPOINTMENT WITH A HEALTH 11 PROFESSIONAL OR LOCAL HEALTH DEPARTMENT.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2025.
