

Election Law - Automatic Voter Registration - State Correctional Facilities

- FOR the purpose of altering the definitions of "automatic voter registration agency" and "applicable transaction" for the purpose of designating the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services as an automatic voter registration agency and requiring the Department to register qualified individuals to vote when they are released from confinement at a State correctional facility; requiring the Department to implement an automatic voter registration system on or before a certain date; and generally relating to automatic voter registration at State correctional facilities.

- 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 16 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 17 Article Election Law
- 18 3–203.
- 19 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.
- 20 (2) (i) "Applicable transaction" means:
- 21 1. at the Motor Vehicle Administration, an initial application 22 for or renewal of a driver's license or identification card, or a change of name or address on
- 23 an existing driver's license or identification card, or any other transaction in which the

3 4	2. at the Maryland Health Benefit Exchange, any application for or renewal of health insurance coverage;
5 6 7 8	3. at a local department of social services, an initial application for a State or federally funded public assistance program or an application for a recertification, renewal, or change of name or address relating to a State or federally funded public assistance program; [or]
9 10 11	4. at the Mobility Certification Office in the Maryland Transit Administration, an initial application for paratransit service or an application for recertification for paratransit service; OR
12 13 14	5. AT THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY AND CORRECTIONAL SERVICES, THE RELEASE OF AN INDIVIDUAL CONFINED AT A STATE CORRECTIONAL FACILITY.
15 16	(ii) "Applicable transaction" includes any transaction described in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph that is completed online.
17	(3) "Automatic voter registration agency" means:
18	(i) the Motor Vehicle Administration;
19	(ii) the Maryland Health Benefit Exchange;
20	(iii) local departments of social services; [and]
21 22	(iv) the Mobility Certification Office in the Maryland Transit Administration; AND
23 24	(V) THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY AND CORRECTIONAL SERVICES.
25 26	(4) "Automatic voter registration system" means a system that, as an integral part of each applicable transaction at an automatic voter registration agency:
27	(i) informs an applicant:
28 29 30 31	1. that the applicant shall be registered to vote or shall have a voter registration record updated, if applicable, unless the applicant declines to register to vote or update a voter registration record or if the applicant is not eligible to register to vote;

1 2 3	(II) THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY AND CORRECTIONAL SERVICES SHALL IMPLEMENT AN AUTOMATIC VOTER REGISTRATION SYSTEM ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 1, 2025.
4	(c) An automatic voter registration system:
5 6	(1) may not require any information that duplicates the information required to complete an applicable transaction;
7 8	(2) shall require only the minimum amount of information necessary for both an applicable transaction and a voter registration to:
9	(i) prevent duplicate voter registration; and
10 11	(ii) enable election officials to review the eligibility of an applicant and to administer voter registration and other aspects of the election process; and
12 13 14	(3) shall inform an applicant that if the applicant does not select a political party affiliation, the individual will be designated as not affiliated with a political party and will be unable to vote in a party primary election.
15 16	(d) An agent of an automatic voter registration agency who is responsible for carrying out the requirements of this section may not:
17 18	(1) seek to influence an applicant's political preference or party registration;
19	(2) display any political preference or party allegiance; or
20 21	(3) make any statement to an applicant or take any action the purpose or effect of which is to:
22	(i) discourage the applicant from registering to vote; or
23 24	(ii) lead the applicant to believe that a decision to register or not to register has any bearing on the availability of services or benefits.
25 26	(e) The State Board shall ensure that each individual whose voter registration information is transmitted to the State Board through an automatic voter registration

28 (f) If the State Board receives notice from an individual that the individual was 29 inadvertently registered to vote through an automatic voter registration agency after 30 declining to register to vote, the State Board shall correct the error in accordance with § 31 3–601.1 of this title.

- 1 (g) Voter registration information or information relating to the decision of an applicant at an automatic voter registration agency to decline to register to vote may not 3 be used for any purpose other than the maintenance of registration statistics, election 4 administration, or prosecution of criminal violations of the election law.
- 5 (h) Notwithstanding § 3–501 of this title and § 4–401 of the General Provisions 6 Article, the identity of an automatic voter registration agency through which a particular 7 voter has registered may not be disclosed to the public.
- 8 (i) The State Board may adopt regulations as necessary to implement this 9 section.
- 10 (j) (1) Each automatic voter registration agency shall[:
- 11 (i) on or before July 1, 2019, submit a report, in accordance with §
- 12 2–1257 of the State Government Article, to the Senate Education, Health, and 13 Environmental Affairs Committee and the House Committee on Ways and Means that
- 14 describes:
- 15 1. the efforts of the automatic voter registration agency to register voters in the preceding calendar year; and
- 17 2. the implementation of an automatic voter registration 18 system; and
- (ii)], on or before January 1, [2020] **2025**, and January 1 each subsequent year, submit a report, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, to the Senate Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs Committee and the House Committee on Ways and Means that describes:
- 23 the number of individuals who completed an applicable 24 transaction in the preceding calendar year at the automatic voter registration agency and 25 the number of those individuals who registered to vote or updated a voter registration 26 record; and
- 27 2. any efforts the automatic voter registration agency plans 28 to make to improve the efficiency and effectiveness of the voter registration process at the 29 agency.
- 30 (2) The Department of Human Services shall consolidate and submit the 31 reports required under paragraph (1)(i) and (ii) of this subsection as a single document on 32 behalf of all the local departments of social services.
- 33 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, notwithstanding § 3–203(j)(1) 34 of the Election Law Article, as enacted by this Act, the Department of Public Safety and 35 Correctional Services:

- 1 (1) is not required to submit the report due on January 1, 2025, under § 3–203(j)(1) of the Election Law Article, as enacted by this Act; and
- 3 (2) shall submit the report required under § 3–203(j)(1) of the Election Law Article, as enacted by this Act, on January 1, 2026, and January 1 of each subsequent year.
- 5 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 6 January 1, 2025.
