- 1 (4) "TRAFFIC STOP" MEANS AN INSTANCE WHEN A LAW 2 ENFORCEMENT OFFICER STOPS THE DRIVER OF A MOTOR VEHICLE AND DETAINS 3 THE DRIVER FOR ANY PERIOD OF TIME FOR A SUSPECTED VIOLATION OF THE 4 MARYLAND VEHICLE LAW OR OF ANY OTHER LAW.
- (B) EXCEPT UNDER EXIGENT CIRCUMSTANCES, AT THE TIME THAT A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER MAKES A TRAFFIC STOP, THE LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER IMMEDIATELY SHALL DISCLOSE TO THE DRIVER OF THE MOTOR VEHICLE THE LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER'S NAME, BADGE NUMBER, AND THE REASON FOR THE TRAFFIC STOP.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2016.
