A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Health Occupations - Primary Care Providers - Adverse Childhood Experiences Screening

FOR the purpose of establishing the Adverse Childhood Experiences Screening Grant Program; specifying the purpose of the Program; requiring the Maryland Department of Health to administer the Program; requiring the Department to adopt certain regulations; establishing the Adverse Childhood Experiences Screening Grant Program Fund as a special, nonlapsing fund; specifying the purpose of the Fund; requiring the Department to administer the Fund; requiring the State Treasurer to hold the Fund and the Comptroller to account for the Fund; specifying the contents of the Fund; specifying the purpose for which the Fund may be used; providing for the investment of money in and expenditures from the Fund; requiring the Department to establish a certain course on or before a certain date; requiring that a certain course include the use of certain tools; requiring a primary care provider to complete a certain course on or before a certain date and with a certain frequency thereafter; requiring, beginning in a certain fiscal year, that the Governor include in the annual budget bill a certain appropriation to the Department for a certain purpose; requiring that the Governor include in the annual budget bill in a certain fiscal year a certain appropriation to the Department for a certain purpose; requiring the Department to include certain findings in a certain course under certain circumstances; defining certain terms; making certain provisions of this Act contingent on the taking effect of another Act; and generally relating to primary care providers and screening related to adverse childhood experiences.

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 6 7 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 19 (2) PAY ANY ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES ASSOCIATED WITH THE
- 20 PROGRAM.
- 21 (G) (1) THE STATE TREASURER SHALL INVEST THE MONEY OF THE FUND
- 22 IN THE SAME MANNER AS OTHER STATE MONEY MAY BE INVESTED.
- 23 (2) ANY INTEREST EARNINGS OF THE FUND SHALL BE CREDITED TO
- 24 THE GENERAL FUND OF THE STATE.
- 25 (H) EXPENDITURES FROM THE FUND MAY BE MADE ONLY IN ACCORDANCE

- 1 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "PRIMARY CARE PROVIDER" MEANS THE FOLLOWING 2 HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS WHO PROVIDE PRIMARY CARE TO A PATIENT:
- 3 (1) A LICENSED PHYSICIAN;
- 4 (2) A LICENSED REGISTERED NURSE WHO PRACTICES AS A 5 REGISTERED NURSE PRACTITIONER; OR
- 6 (3) A LICENSED PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT.
- 7 (B) (1) ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 1, 2022, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL 8 DEVELOP A COURSE ON INTEGRATING MENTAL AND PHYSICAL HEALTH CARE IN A 9 PRIMARY CARE SETTING.
- 10 (2) THE COURSE DEVELOPED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS
 11 SUBSECTION SHALL INCLUDE SCREENING TOOLS A PRIMARY CARE PROVIDER CAN
 12 USE TO IDENTIFY AND TREAT MINORS WHO HAVE A MENTAL HEALTH DISORDER

- 17 (D) FOR FISCAL YEAR 2022 AND EACH FISCAL YEAR THEREAFTER, THE
 18 GOVERNOR SHALL INCLUDE IN THE ANNUAL BUDGET BILL AN APPROPRIATION OF
 19 \$5,000,000 TO THE DEPARTMENT FOR THE PURPOSE OF CARRYING OUT THIS
 20 SECTION.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, for fiscal year 2022, the Governor shall include in the annual budget bill an appropriation of \$45,000,000 to the Adverse Childhood Experiences Screening Grant Program Fund established under \$ 13–803 of the Health General Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Maryland Department of Health shall include in the course on integrating mental health care in a primary care setting developed under § 1–225 of the Health Occupations Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act, the following findings of the Workgroup on Screening Related to Adverse Childhood Experiences convened under Chapter ____ (S.B. ___/H.B. ____)(0lr0642) of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2020:

the Workgroup.

SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 3 of this Act shall take effect July 1, 2020, contingent on the taking effect of Chapter ____ (S.B. ___/H.B. ___)(0lr0642) of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2020, and if Chapter ____ (S.B. ___/H.B. ___)(0lr0642) does not take effect, Section 3 of this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be null and void.

SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July $8\,\,$ 1, 2020.
