### 1 AN ACT concerning

# Labor and Employment – Equal Pay for Equal Work – Wage Range Transparency

- 4 FOR the purpose of altering the requirement that an employer disclose certain wage 5 information to an applicant for employment; requiring an employer to disclose 6 certain wage information in certain postings and to certain employees at certain 7 times; requiring an employer to set the wage range disclosed in good faith; requiring 8 the Commissioner of Labor and Industry to develop and make available to employers 9 a form that an employer may use to comply with certain wage disclosure requirements; prohibiting an employer from taking a certain retaliatory action; 10 requiring each employer to keep a record of compliance with certain provisions of 11 12 this Act for at least a certain time period; and generally relating to equal pay for 13 equal work.

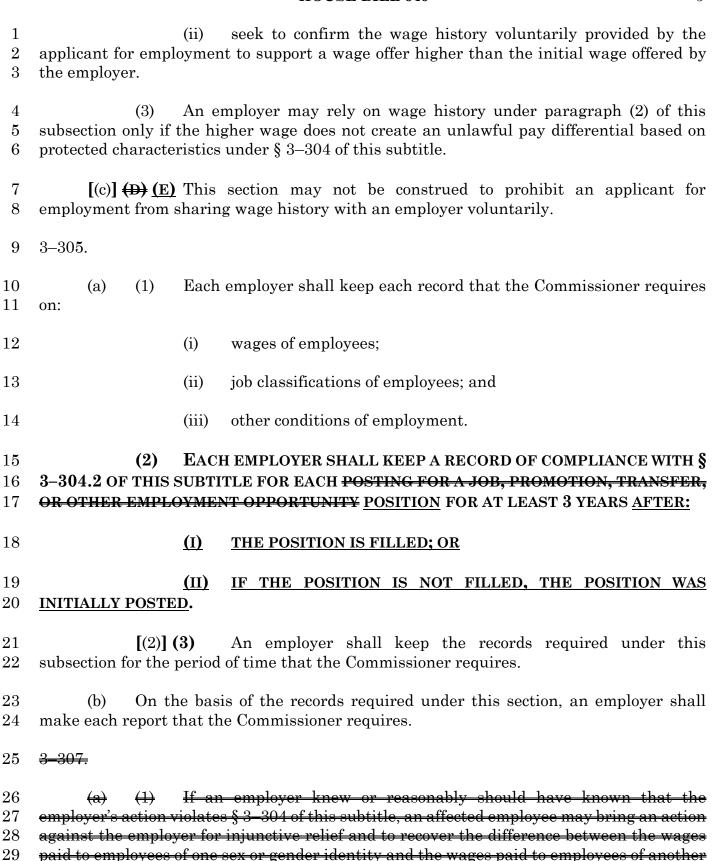
