

4 5 6	(ii) An individual may dispense wine and liquor during a basebal game only from a stationary structure that is in the stadium and equipped with a motor vehicle driver's license scanner.
7 8	(4) A license holder may not allow a roving vendor to dispense wine and liquor.
9 10	(5) A license holder may not allow a person to carry beer, wine, and liquor onto or off of the licensed premises.
11	(g) The annual license fee is [\$10,000] \$4,000 .
