1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Vehicle Laws – Equipment on Motorcycles – Auxiliary Lighting**

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing an operator of a motorcycle to use certain auxiliary
4 lighting on the motorcycle; and generally relating to motorcycle lighting.

5 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

10 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
11 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

12 **Article – Transportation**

13 22–221.

14 (l) (1) Subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection, a motorcycle may be
15 equipped with, **AND AN OPERATOR OF A MOTORCYCLE MAY USE**, the following
16 auxiliary lighting:

17 (i) Blue dot illumination;

18 (ii) Standard bulb running lights; or

1 (iii) Light-emitting diode pods and strips added to protect the
2 driver.

3 (2) (i) Lighting under this subsection shall be:

- 4 1. Nonblinking;
- 5 2. Nonflashing;
- 6 3. Nonoscillating; and
- 7 4. Directed toward the engine and the drive train of the
8 motorcycle.

9 (ii) Lighting under this subsection may not:

- 10 1. Be attached to the wheels of the motorcycle; or
- 11 2. Emit a red or blue light.

12 (iii) Blue dot illumination:

- 13 1. May be located only on the rear of a motorcycle as
14 part of or adjacent to the rear brake light; and
- 15 2. May not exceed three-quarters of an inch in diameter.

16 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
17 ~~October~~ June 1, 2010.
