10 11	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 15	(a) In addition to the jurisdiction specified in Subtitle 8 of this title, the court has exclusive original jurisdiction over:			
16	(1) A child:			
17	(i) Who is at least [13] 11 years old alleged to be delinquent; or			
18 19	(ii) Except as provided in subsection (d) of this section, who is at least 10 years old alleged to have committed an act:			



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- 1 That, if committed by an adult, would constitute a crime 2 of violence, as defined in § 14–101 of the Criminal Law Article; or
- 3 2. Arising out of the same incident as an act listed in item 1 4 of this item;
- 5 (2) A child who is in need of supervision;
- 6 (3) A child who has received a citation for a violation;
- 7 (4) Except as provided in subsection (d)(6) of this section, a peace order 8 proceeding in which the respondent is a child; and
- 9 (5) Proceedings arising under the Interstate Compact on Juveniles.
  - (b) The court has concurrent jurisdiction over proceedings against an adult for the violation of § 3–8A–30 of this subtitle. However, the court may waive its jurisdiction under this subsection upon its own motion or upon the motion of any party to the proceeding, if charges against the adult arising from the same incident are pending in the criminal court. Upon motion by either the State's Attorney or the adult charged under § 3–8A–30 of this subtitle, the court shall waive its jurisdiction, and the adult shall be tried in the criminal court according to the usual criminal procedure.
- 17 (c) The jurisdiction of the court is concurrent with that of the District Court in 18 any criminal case arising under the compulsory public school attendance laws of this State.
- 19 (d) The court does not have jurisdiction over:
  - (1) A child at least 14 years old alleged to have done an act that, if committed by an adult, would be a crime punishable by life imprisonment, as well as all other charges against the child arising out of the same incident, unless an order removing the proceeding to the court has been filed under § 4–202 of the Criminal Procedure Article;
- 24 (2) A child at least 16 years old alleged to have done an act in violation of 25 any provision of the Transportation Article or other traffic law or ordinance, except an act 26 that prescribes a penalty of incarceration;
- 27 (3) A child at least 16 years old alleged to have done an act in violation of any provision of law, rule, or regulation governing the use or operation of a boat, except an act that prescribes a penalty of incarceration;
- 30 (4) A child at least 16 years old alleged to have committed any of the 31 following crimes, as well as all other charges against the child arising out of the same 32 incident, unless an order removing the proceeding to the court has been filed under § 33 4–202 of the Criminal Procedure Article:
  - (i) Abduction;

28 (6) A peace order proceeding in which the victim, as defined in § 3-8A-01(cc)(1)(ii) of this subtitle, is a person eligible for relief, as defined in § 4-501 of the 30 Family Law Article; or

- 1 (7) Except as provided in subsection (a)(1)(ii) of this section, a delinquency 2 proceeding against a child who is under the age of [13] 11 years.
- 3 (e) If the child is charged with two or more violations of the Maryland Vehicle
  4 Law, another traffic law or ordinance, or the State Boat Act, allegedly arising out of the
  5 same incident and which would result in the child being brought before both the court and
  6 a court exercising criminal jurisdiction, the court has exclusive jurisdiction over all of the
  7 charges.
- 8 (f) A child under the age of 13 years may not be charged with a crime.
- 9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 10 October 1, 2023.
