13	Preamble
14 15 16	WHEREAS, Local governments in Maryland must have authority from the Maryland General Assembly in order to impose a development impact fee or an excise tax; and
17 18 19	WHEREAS, Code home rule counties are authorized collectively to impose specified development impact fees and excise taxes, and many counties have specific authorizations from the Maryland General Assembly; and
20 21	WHEREAS, Title 20, Subtitle 7 of the Local Government Article provides for the specific uses of revenues received from development impact fees; and
22 23	WHEREAS, County Commissioners of code counties may impose development impact fees by public local law to finance any of the capital costs of additional or expanded



- public works improvements, and facilities required to accommodate new construction or development; and
- WHEREAS, The Supreme Court of the United States, in Sheetz v. County of El
- 4 Dorado, 601 U.S. ____ (2024), held that local government permit conditions (1) must have
- 5 an "essential nexus" to the government's land use interests, and "rough proportionality" to
- 6 the development's impact on the land use interest; and (2) may not require a landowner to
- 7 give up or pay more than is necessary to mitigate harms caused from new development;

- 9 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 10 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 13 (A) THIS SECTION APPLIES ONLY TO A COUNTY THAT:
- 14 (1) IS A CHARTER COUNTY THAT IMPOSES, BY LAW, DEVELOPMENT

- 16 (2) IS A CODE COUNTY WITH PUBLIC LOCAL LAWS THAT REQUIRE THE

- 18 (3) IS A COMMISSION COUNTY THAT:
- 19 (I) HAS BEEN AUTHORIZED TO ENACT DEVELOPMENT IMPACT

- 21 (II) HAS ENACTED, BY LOCAL LAW, DEVELOPMENT IMPACT

- 1 (2) THE PORTION OF THE DEVELOPMENT IMPACT FEES, 2 SURCHARGES, OR EXCISE TAXES PAID TO THE COUNTY BY LEGISLATIVE, 3 COUNCILMANIC, OR COMMISSIONER DISTRICT IN WHICH THE CONSTRUCTION OR 4 DEVELOPMENT PROJECT THAT IS SUBJECT TO THE FEE, SURCHARGE, OR TAX IS LOCATED; AND
- 6 EXCEPT AS PROVIDED BY SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, THE 7 PORTION OF DEVELOPMENT IMPACT FEES, SURCHARGES, OR EXCISE TAXES USED TO 8 FUND CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS IN THE LEGISLATIVE, COUNCILMANIC, OR **DISTRICT** 9 COMMISSIONER **THAT ARE** RELATED TO **TRANSPORTATION** IMPROVEMENTS OR MAINTENANCE, SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION OR MAINTENANCE, OR 10 ANY OTHER CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECT THAT RECEIVED FUNDING FROM 11 DEVELOPMENT IMPACT FEES, SURCHARGES, OR EXCISE TAXES. 12
- 13 (C) IF THE FUNDING UNDER SUBSECTION (B)(3) OF THIS SECTION IS
 14 COLLECTED UNDER SUBTITLE 8 OF THIS TITLE, THE REPORT MAY EXCLUDE THE
 15 INFORMATION OTHERWISE REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION (B)(3) OF THIS SECTION.
- 16 (D) (1) SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, A COUNTY SHALL MAKE THE REPORT PUBLICLY AVAILABLE ON THE COUNTY'S WEBSITE.
- 18 **(2)** A COUNTY THAT DOES NOT MAINTAIN A WEBSITE SHALL MAKE 19 THE REPORT PUBLICLY AVAILABLE BY OTHER REASONABLE MEANS.
- 20 (3) A COUNTY MAY SUBMIT THE REPORT AS PART OF ANOTHER 21 REPORT REQUIRED UNDER THIS ARTICLE.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2025.
