Natural Resources - Fishery Management Plans - Oysters

FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Natural Resources to convene the Oyster Advisory Commission, in coordination with the University of Maryland Center for Environmental Science, on or before a certain date; providing for the membership of the Commission; requiring certain persons to provide information to the Commission under certain circumstances but prohibiting certain persons from participating as voting members; establishing certain requirements for the fishery management plan for oysters; requiring the Department of Natural Resources, in coordination with the University of Maryland Center for Environmental Science, to convene a certain stakeholder workgroup Science and the Commission, to develop a certain package of consensus recommendations for enhancing and implementing the fishery management plan for oysters; providing for the membership of the stakeholder workgroup; requiring the stakeholder workgroup Commission, with certain assistance, to develop certain recommendations based on a certain process, review

35 WHEREAS, Large connected oyster populations provide a number of environmental 36 benefits to the Chesapeake Bay ecosystem, including reef habitat for finfish, shellfish, and 37 other marine life, improved water quality, reduced sedimentation, carbon storage, and 38 increased shellfish propagation; and

WHEREAS, The oyster population in the Bay is languishing at 1% of historic populations a historic low; and
