A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Education - Maryland Advisory Council for Virtual Learning - Establishment

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland Advisory Council for Virtual Learning 4 within the Department of Education; requiring the Department to provide staff 5 for the Council; establishing the mission of the Council; identifying the 6 membership of the Council; establishing the membership term; requiring the 7 State Superintendent or the Governor to appoint a member in the event of a 8 vacancy; requiring the Council members to elect the Council chair; prohibiting a 9 member from receiving compensation except under certain circumstances; establishing a quorum of the Council; requiring the Council to meet for a certain 10 number of times; establishing the responsibilities of the Council; requiring the 11 12Council to submit a certain report by a certain time; defining a certain term; and generally relating to the Maryland Advisory Council for Virtual Learning. 13
