A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Commission to Study the Impact of the Common Core State Standards in**
3 **Harford County**

4 FOR the purpose of establishing the Commission to Study the Impact of the Common
5 Core State Standards in Harford County; providing for the composition, chair,
6 and staffing of the Commission; prohibiting a member of the Commission from
7 receiving certain compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain
8 expenses; requiring the Commission to study a certain impact, hold certain
9 public meetings, evaluate certain concerns, and make recommendations
10 regarding certain matters; requiring the Commission to report its findings and
11 recommendations to certain persons on or before a certain date; providing for
12 the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Commission to Study
13 the Impact of the Common Core State Standards in Harford County.

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
15 MARYLAND, That:

16 (a) There is a Commission to Study the Impact of the Common Core State
17 Standards in Harford County.

18 (b) The Commission consists of the following members:

19 (1) the Chair of the Harford County Senators, or the Chair's designee;

20 (2) the Chair of the Harford County House Delegation, or the Chair's
21 designee;

22 (3) one representative of the Harford County Council of Parent
23 Teacher Association, appointed by the Council;

1 (4) one representative of the Harford County Education Association,
2 appointed by the Association; and

3 (5) the following members, appointed by the Harford County
4 Executive:

5 (i) two teachers who work in public schools in Harford County;

6 (ii) one principal of a public school in Harford County;

7 (iii) two individuals who are parents of students currently
8 enrolled in public schools in Harford County; and

9 (iv) two experts in the field of education.

10 (c) The following individuals may not be members of the Commission:

11 (1) the Superintendent of the Harford County Public Schools; and

12 (2) a member of the Harford County Board of Education.

13 (d) The County Executive shall designate the chair of the Commission.

14 (e) The Harford County public schools shall provide staff for the
15 Commission.

16 (f) A member of the Commission:

17 (1) may not receive compensation as a member of the Commission; but

18 (2) is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard
19 State Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.

20 (g) The Commission shall:

21 (1) study the impact of the implementation of the Common Core State
22 Standards on students, teachers, families of students, and the general public in
23 Harford County;

24 (2) hold at least six public meetings, one in each councilmanic district in
25 Harford County, to present information about the Common Core State Standards and
26 provide any interested member of the general public an opportunity to:

27 (i) ask questions about the standards and the implementation of
28 the standards; and

1 (ii) testify on experiences with and concerns about the
2 implementation of the standards;

3 (3) evaluate any concerns raised at the public meetings relating to the
4 implementation of the Common Core State Standards; and

5 (4) make recommendations regarding the implementation of the
6 Common Core State Standards in Harford County.

7 (h) On or before January 1, 2015, the Commission shall report its findings
8 and recommendations to the Harford County Executive, the Harford County Council,
9 and, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, the Harford County
10 Senators and House Delegation.

11 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
12 July 1, 2014. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of June 30,
13 2015, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be
14 abrogated and of no further force and effect.
