## CHAPTER \_\_\_\_\_

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Orphans' Court – Minor – Guardianship of the Person**

3 FOR the purpose of altering the authority of an orphans' court to exercise jurisdiction  
4 over guardianship of the person of a minor by repealing a certain requirement  
5 that the presiding judge of the orphans' court be a member of the Bar of  
6 Maryland; providing that an orphans' court may exercise jurisdiction over  
7 guardianship of the person of a minor in uncontested matters; providing for the  
8 application of this Act; and generally relating to the jurisdiction of an orphans'  
9 court over guardianship of the person of a minor.

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 **Article – Estates and Trusts**

1 (a) (1) [The] **SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, THE**  
2 orphans' courts and the circuit courts have concurrent jurisdiction over guardians of  
3 the person of a minor and over protective proceedings for minors.

4 (2) Upon petition of an interested person, a matter initiated in the  
5 orphans' court may be transferred to the circuit court.

6 (b) Subject to Title 13.5 of this article, the circuit courts have exclusive  
7 jurisdiction over protective proceedings for disabled persons.

8 (c) (1) An orphans' court may exercise jurisdiction over guardianship of  
9 the person of a minor [if the presiding judge of the orphans' court is a member of the  
10 bar] **IN UNCONTESTED MATTERS**, regardless of whether the minor who is the subject  
11 of the petition for guardianship of the person has property, may inherit property, or is  
12 destitute.

13 (2) An orphans' court that exercises jurisdiction or is requested to  
14 exercise jurisdiction under this subsection may:

15 (i) Transfer the matter to the circuit court on a finding that the  
16 best interests of the child require utilization of the equitable powers of the circuit  
17 court; and

18 (ii) Waive the costs, if any, of a transfer under this paragraph.

19 **SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED,** That this Act shall be  
20 construed to apply only prospectively and may not be applied or interpreted to have  
21 any effect on or application to any petition for guardianship of the person of a minor  
22 filed before the effective date of this Act.

23 **SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED,** That this Act shall take effect  
24 October 1, 2012.
