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- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland Food System Resiliency Council; providing 4 for the composition, co-chairs, co-vice chairs, and staffing of the Council; providing 5 that a member of the Council may not receive compensation but may be reimbursed 6 for certain expenses; authorizing the Council to establish certain subcommittees; 7 specifying the duties of the Council; requiring the Council to submit certain reports 8 to the General Assembly on or before certain dates; making this Act an emergency 9 measure; defining certain terms; and generally relating to the Maryland Food System Resiliency Council. 10

ENSURE THAT ALL FIVE GEOGRAPHIC AREAS OF THE STATE ARE

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- 1 REPRESENTED BY THE APPOINTED MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL; AND
- 2 (2) APPOINT A SUCCESSOR IN THE EVENT OF A VACANCY ON THE
- 3 COUNCIL.
- 4 (D) (1) (I) THE TERM OF A MEMBER OF THE COUNCIL APPOINTED BY
- 5 THE DIRECTOR IS 3 YEARS.
- 6 (II) AN APPOINTED MEMBER MAY NOT SERVE FOR MORE THAN
- 7 2 CONSECUTIVE THREE YEAR TERMS.
- 8 (2) AT THE END OF A TERM, A MEMBER CONTINUES TO SERVE UNTIL
- 9 A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED AND QUALIFIES.
- 10 (3) A MEMBER WHO IS APPOINTED AFTER A TERM HAS BEGUN SHALL
- 11 SERVE FOR THE REST OF THE TERM OR UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED AND
- 12 QUALIFIES.
- 13 **(E)** A MEMBER OF THE COUNCIL:
- 14 (1) MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION AS A MEMBER OF THE

- 6 University of Maryland College of Agriculture and Natural
- 7 RESOURCES SHALL PROVIDE STAFF FOR THE COUNCIL, AS DEEMED NECESSARY BY

- 1. COORDINATING STATE AND LOCAL LEVEL FOOD
- 18 INSECURITY SERVICES TO SUPPORT RESIDENTS OF THE STATE;

- 20 COMPREHENSIVE MAP OF FOOD INSECURITY ACROSS THE STATE AND IDENTIFY THE

- 23 GRANTS AND OTHER RESOURCES IN ORDER TO ADDRESS FOOD INSECURITY NEEDS;

- 25 RESOURCES AND INCREASE EFFICIENCY; AND
- 5. A. EXPLORING THE ROLE OF AND POTENTIAL FOR
- 27 THE FEDERAL COMMUNITY ELIGIBILITY PROVISION TO ENSURE ALL STUDENTS IN
- 28 THE STATE ARE FED; AND
- 29 B. MAKING RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE MARYLAND

- 1. PROVIDING COORDINATION AND FACILITATION OF
- 16 KNOWLEDGE EXCHANGE AT THE STATE LEVEL; AND
- 17 2. SUPPORTING IDENTIFICATION AND APPLICATION OF
- 18 GRANTS TO OPERATING FUNDS TO SUPPORT EXISTING AND NEW FOOD COUNCIL
- 19 ORGANIZATIONS AS NEEDED; AND
- 20 (IV) TO DEVELOP, ON OR BEFORE NOVEMBER 1, 2021, A
- 21 STRATEGIC PLAN TO INCREASE THE PRODUCTION AND PROCUREMENT OF

- 1. INCREASING THE QUALITY AND QUANTITY OF
- 24 PRODUCTION, AS WELL AS AGGREGATION, MARKETING, AND DISTRIBUTION OF

- 29 FOR MARYLAND FOOD BUSINESSES; AND
- 4. EXPANDING ACCESS TO SMALL SCALE

- 1 MANUFACTURING AND FOOD PRODUCTION INFRASTRUCTURE.
- 2 (B) TO ADVANCE THE GOALS OF THE COUNCIL, THE COUNCIL SHALL
- 3 ENGAGE AND COLLABORATE WITH INTERESTED STAKEHOLDERS, INCLUDING:
- 4 (1) RESIDENTS OF THE STATE WITH LIVED EXPERIENCE OF FOOD
- 5 INSECURITY; AND
- 6 (2) FOOD COUNCIL ORGANIZATIONS AND SIMILAR LOCAL LEVEL 7 FOOD SYSTEM CONVENING ORGANIZATIONS.
- 8 (C) (1) ON OR BEFORE NOVEMBER 1, 2021, THE COUNCIL SHALL SUBMIT
- 9 AN INTERIM REPORT TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1257
- 10 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, ON KEY FINDINGS AND ACTIVITIES
- 11 UNDERTAKEN BY THE COUNCIL.
- 12 (2) ON OR BEFORE NOVEMBER 1, 2022, THE COUNCIL SHALL SUBMIT
- 13 A REPORT TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1257 OF THE
- 14 STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, ON THE COUNCIL'S RECOMMENDATIONS FOR A
- 15 LONG TERM STRUCTURE FOR A STATEWIDE FOOD POLICY COUNCIL INCLUDING
- 16 PROVIDING RECOMMENDATIONS ON:
- 17 (I) APPROPRIATE POLICY AND LEGISLATIVE CHANGES;
- 18 (II) POTENTIAL WAYS TO RESTRUCTURE THE COUNCIL SUCH AS:
- 1. PLACING THE COUNCIL WITHIN A DIFFERENT

- 25 THEREAFTER, THE COUNCIL SHALL SUBMIT A REPORT TO THE GENERAL
- 26 ASSEMBLY, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1257 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE,
- 27 ON KEY FINDINGS AND ACTIVITIES UNDERTAKEN BY THE COUNCIL.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency
- 29 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has
- 30 been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to
- 31 each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is
- 32 enacted.
