5 FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Cybersecurity Council to conduct a certain 6 study on cybersecurity coordination and operations in the State; requiring the 7 Council to submit a certain report to certain committees of the General Assembly on or before a certain date; and generally relating to a report on cybersecurity 8 9 coordination and operations establishing the Cybersecurity Coordination and 10 Operations Office within the Maryland Emergency Management Agency (MEMA): 11 providing for the purpose of the Office; requiring the Director of MEMA to appoint an Executive Director as head of the Office; requiring the Office to be provided with 12 sufficient staff to perform the Office's functions; requiring the Office to establish 13 regional assistance groups to deliver or coordinate support services to political 14 subdivisions, agencies, or regions in accordance with certain requirements: 15 16 authorizing the Office to hire or procure regional coordinators; requiring a certain report annually: defining certain terms; and generally relating to the establishment 17 of the Cybersecurity Coordination and Operations Office within MEMA. 18

It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 1 month and, at the end of July 31, 2022, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
