- 2 (A) IN AN INITIAL CHILD CUSTODY PROCEEDING, WHETHER PENDENTE LITE 3 OR PERMANENT, INVOLVING THE PARENTS OF A CHILD, REGARDLESS OF A PARENT'S MARITAL STATUS OR GENDER, THERE IS A REBUTTABLE PRESUMPTION THAT:
- 5 (1) JOINT LEGAL CUSTODY IS IN THE BEST INTERESTS OF THE CHILD; 6 AND
- 7 (2) JOINT PHYSICAL CUSTODY FOR APPROXIMATELY EQUAL PERIODS 8 OF TIME IS IN THE BEST INTERESTS OF THE CHILD.
- 9 (B) IF THE COURT DETERMINES BY A PREPONDERANCE OF THE EVIDENCE 10 THAT A CO-PARENTING CUSTODY ARRANGEMENT IS NOT IN THE BEST INTERESTS OF 11 THE CHILD, THE COURT MAY AWARD SOLE CUSTODY TO ONE PARENT.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2015.
