A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Office of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing – Deafblind Co-Navigation Services**
3 **Program – Established**

4 FOR the purpose of establishing the Deafblind Co-Navigation Services Program in the
5 Office of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing to provide co-navigation services to deafblind
6 individuals in the State; and generally relating to the Office of the Deaf and Hard of
7 Hearing and the Deafblind Co-Navigation Services Program.

8 BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments,

19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
20 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

21 **Article – State Government**

22 9-2401.

23 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.

[Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.



1 (b) “American Sign Language” means a visual–spatial method of communication
2 that is a distinct language involving the hands, arms, facial markers, and body movements
3 to communicate with others, including through the conveyance of thoughts, words,
4 emotions, and grammatical information.

5 (c) “Behavioral health setting” means a setting that provides:

6 (1) psychiatric or psychological assessment or screening;

7 (2) group or individual psychotherapy, counseling, or treatment; or

8 (3) rehabilitation services for substance use disorders, addictive disorders,
9 mental disorders, or a combination of these disorders.

10 (g) “Deafblind” means those residents of Maryland who have concomitant vision
11 and hearing loss.

12 (h) “Director” means the Director of the Office.

13 (k) “Legal setting” includes:

14 (1) court proceedings;

15 (2) attorney–client conferences;

16 (3) investigations by law enforcement;

17 (4) depositions;

18 (5) witness interviews;

19 (6) real estate settlements; and

20 (7) administrative and legislative hearings.

21 (m) “Medical setting” includes:

22 (1) an acute care hospital;

23 (2) an urgent care center;

24 (3) an outpatient clinic;

25 (4) short–term care facilities;

26 (5) long–term care facilities;

1 (6) a physician’s office; and

2 (7) home health care.

3 (o) “Office” means the Office of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing.

4 (r) “School setting” means a setting in which the following are provided:

5 (1) educational programs or services offered by a public or nonpublic
6 school; or

7 (2) career training programs for secondary education students that are
8 regulated by the State Department of Education.

11 **PART IV. DEAFBLIND CO–NAVIGATION SERVICES PROGRAM.**

12 **9–2438.**

13 (A) IN THIS PART THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS
14 INDICATED.

15 (B) “COMMUNICATION MODE” INCLUDES COMMUNICATION THROUGH:

16 (1) AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE OR SIGNED ENGLISH BY BOTH
17 TACTILE AND VISUAL MEANS;

18 (2) AUDITORY AMPLIFICATION, INCLUDING AN ASSISTIVE LISTENING
19 DEVICE OR A PERSONAL HEARING AID; OR

20 (3) PROTACTILE LANGUAGE.

21 (C) (1) “CO–NAVIGATION SERVICES” MEANS SERVICES PROVIDED TO A
22 DEAFBLIND INDIVIDUAL:

23 (I) BY PROVIDING VISUAL AND ENVIRONMENTAL
24 INFORMATION OR SIGHTED SERVICES TO ASSIST WITH COMMUNICATION
25 ACCESSIBILITY;

26 (II) IN THE INDIVIDUAL’S PREFERRED LANGUAGE AND
27 COMMUNICATION MODE; AND

1 (III) TO ASSIST THE INDIVIDUAL WITH ACCESSING THE
2 INDIVIDUAL'S PHYSICAL SURROUNDINGS AND MAKING INFORMED DECISIONS
3 REGARDING THE INDIVIDUAL'S SURROUNDINGS.

4 (2) "CO-NAVIGATION SERVICES" DOES NOT INCLUDE:

5 (I) COMPLETING ERRANDS OR PROVIDING PERSONAL CARE
6 SERVICES FOR AN INDIVIDUAL;

7 (II) INTERPRETING FOR AN INDIVIDUAL IN A BEHAVIORAL
8 HEALTH SETTING, LEGAL SETTING, MEDICAL SETTING, SCHOOL SETTING, OR OTHER
9 FORMAL SETTING;

10 (III) MAKING DECISIONS FOR AN INDIVIDUAL; OR

11 (IV) TEACHING OR INSTRUCTING AN INDIVIDUAL.

12 (D) "PROGRAM" MEANS THE DEAFBLIND CO-NAVIGATION SERVICES
13 PROGRAM.

14 (E) "PROTACTILE LANGUAGE" MEANS A METHOD OF COMMUNICATION
15 BASED ON TOUCH USED BY DEAFBLIND INDIVIDUALS.

17 (A) THERE IS A DEAFBLIND CO-NAVIGATION SERVICES PROGRAM WITHIN
18 THE OFFICE.

19 (B) THE PURPOSE OF THE PROGRAM IS TO PROVIDE CO-NAVIGATION
20 SERVICES TO DEAFBLIND RESIDENTS OF THE STATE.

21 (C) THE PROGRAM SHALL BE AVAILABLE STATEWIDE.

22 (D) CO-NAVIGATION SERVICES OFFERED BY THE PROGRAM SHALL BE
23 PROVIDED BY AN INDIVIDUAL WHO HAS RECEIVED TRAINING AS A CO-NAVIGATOR.

25 THE OFFICE SHALL ENSURE THE PROGRAM PROVIDES QUALITY SERVICES BY:

26 (1) IDENTIFYING FUNDING SOURCES FOR THE PROGRAM THAT WILL
27 REDUCE THE PROGRAM'S RELIANCE ON STATE FUNDING;

1 **(2) MONITORING THE COMPLIANCE OF CO-NAVIGATORS WITH RULES**
2 **ESTABLISHED BY THE OFFICE; AND**

3 **(3) PROVIDING, OR FUNDING AND SUPPORTING, TRAINING**
4 **PROGRAMS FOR:**

5 **(I) CO-NAVIGATORS PROVIDING SERVICES THROUGH THE**
6 **PROGRAM; AND**

7 **(II) DEAFBLIND INDIVIDUALS TO FACILITATE EFFECTIVE USE**
8 **OF THE SERVICES OFFERED BY THE PROGRAM.**

10 **(A) THE DIRECTOR MAY ESTABLISH AN ADVISORY COMMITTEE TO ADVISE**
11 **THE OFFICE ON DEVELOPING AND OPERATING THE PROGRAM.**

12 **(B) (1) SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE**
13 **DIRECTOR MAY PROVIDE FOR THE SIZE AND MEMBERSHIP OF THE ADVISORY**
14 **COMMITTEE.**

15 **(2) IF AN ADVISORY COMMITTEE IS ESTABLISHED, THE COMMITTEE**
16 **SHALL INCLUDE DEAFBLIND INDIVIDUALS AND OTHER STAKEHOLDERS.**

18 **(A) (1) THE PROGRAM SHALL PROVIDE CO-NAVIGATION SERVICES AT NO**
19 **COST TO AN INDIVIDUAL RECEIVING THE SERVICE.**

20 **(2) THE OFFICE MAY CHARGE AND ACCEPT PAYMENT FROM PRIVATE**
21 **OR PUBLIC INSURERS FOR CO-NAVIGATION SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE PROGRAM.**

22 **(B) THE OFFICE SHALL:**

23 **(1) REIMBURSE CO-NAVIGATORS WHO PROVIDE CO-NAVIGATION**
24 **SERVICES THROUGH THE PROGRAM; AND**

25 **(2) ESTABLISH A TIERED WAGE SCALE FOR CO-NAVIGATORS IN THE**
26 **PROGRAM THAT ACCOUNTS FOR A CO-NAVIGATOR'S LEVEL OF:**

27 **(I) FLUENCY AND SKILL IN COMMUNICATION MODES AND**
28 **SIGHTED GUIDE-MOBILITY FOR DEAFBLIND INDIVIDUALS; AND**

1 **(II) TRAINING IN COMMUNICATION MODES AND IN SIGHTED**
2 **GUIDE-MOBILITY TECHNIQUES FOR DEAFBLIND INDIVIDUALS.**

4 **THE OFFICE MAY ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT THIS SECTION.**

5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
6 1, 2024.
