19 WHEREAS, Maryland has a long history of environmental stewardship and a
20 commitment to protecting the natural beauty and resources of the State; and

1 WHEREAS, Climate change poses a significant threat to our environment, economy,
2 and public health; and

3 WHEREAS, Maryland is uniquely positioned to lead in climate change education as
4 a state that possesses diverse ecosystems, vulnerable coastal areas, and the Chesapeake
5 Bay, all of which are directly impacted by climate pollution; and

6 WHEREAS, Education plays a vital role in raising awareness about climate change
7 and its causes, consequences, and solutions; and

8 WHEREAS, Institutions of higher education, research organizations, and
9 environmental and advocacy groups in the State are at the forefront of climate change
10 research and education and are the State's partners in this critical effort; and

11 WHEREAS, Maryland is dedicated to fostering a culture of sustainability and
12 environmental responsibility among its residents, businesses, and institutions; and

13 WHEREAS, Maryland leads the nation in its efforts to reduce greenhouse gas
14 emissions that cause climate pollution; now, therefore,

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
16 That Section(s) 7-601 of Article – General Provisions of the Annotated Code of Maryland
17 be renumbered to be Section(s) 7-602.

18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland read
19 as follows:

20 **Article – General Provisions**

21 **7-601.**

22 **(A) THE GOVERNOR ANNUALLY SHALL PROCLAIM THE FIRST WEEK OF**
23 **APRIL AS MARYLAND CLIMATE EDUCATION WEEK.**

24 **(B) THE PROCLAMATION SHALL URGE RESIDENTS OF ALL AGES TO:**

25 **(1) PARTICIPATE IN EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES AND INITIATIVES**
26 **THAT PROMOTE AN AWARENESS OF CLIMATE CHANGE; AND**

27 **(2) TAKE ACTION TOWARD THE STATE'S CLIMATE COMMITMENTS.**

28 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
29 October 1, 2024.
